#### WHAT IS BEST COUNTRIES?

<u>Best Countries</u> is a dynamic multimedia data portal that includes rankings, interactive data visualizations and insightful reporting from and about countries all over the world.

#### WHAT ARE WE LOOKING FOR?

We're looking for reported (at least three sources, ideally more) stories that shed light on trends, challenges and successes occurring in countries in all regions of the globe. Articles can explore social, political, environmental, health and other issues, and can include feature stories, profiles and Q&As. Stories don't need to have a U.S. foreign policy angle to work for us.

Effective stories include pieces exploring the consequences of Hong Kong residents <u>flooding</u> <u>into the U.K.</u>, <u>political turmoil in Lebanon</u>, South Africa's <u>debate over sex work</u> and Chile's <u>evolving relationship</u> with the Catholic Church.

We value color (vivid scenes and descriptions that come from on-the-ground reporting) and originality. If your story topic has been reported before, we'll need a fresh angle.

#### WHAT ARE YOUR RATES?

Rates depend on the length and scope of the article assigned, and can go up to \$500 for a well-reported piece.

Many of our stories highlight state politics that are helping – or failing – residents, and we're interested in exploring novel policies and approaches put forward by states. Stories don't need to reflect our rankings – though we have a treasure trove of data on our site that can be helpful in terms of story ideas.

#### WHAT IS HEALTHIEST COMMUNITIES?

<u>Healthiest Communities</u> is a rankings and analysis platform that explores how communities across the United States are working to improve the health of their residents by addressing direct health issues as well as upstream social determinants of health such as housing, employment, food access, education, public safety and more.

#### WHAT ARE WE LOOKING FOR?

We're looking for reported (at least three sources, ideally more) stories that shed light on health and health-related issues confronting communities (i.e., a county, city, town, neighborhood, people group), along with solutions to those problems. Articles can explore direct health topics such as disease, vaccinations, medical care and health insurance, as well as social, political, economic, environmental and other issues that drive health outcomes.

Articles can include feature stories, profiles and Q&As. Example pieces include a look at the <u>disparate impact of food allergies by race</u>, a collaborative <u>approach to curbing suicides</u>, how the <u>HIV epidemic and a housing crunch</u> has threatened transgender people in Florida, the <u>search for racial and ethnic diversity in drug trials</u>, and efforts to curb <u>unnecessary C-sections</u>.

We value color (vivid scenes and descriptions that come from on-the-ground reporting), anecdotal ledes, angles backed by hard data and originality. If your story topic has been reported before, we'll need a fresh approach.
