The abstract should include the background section of the problem, the research objectives, the research method, and the main results and conclusions. 1. INTRODUCTION

The Journal on Mathematics Education Research publishes articles in Mathematics Education in both Indonesian and English. Articles are written using Microsoft Word with a single-column format, Times New Roman font, size 12 pt, 1.0 line spacing, and justified alignment. Each paragraph begins with a first-line indent of 1.25 cm, and each page is numbered at the bottom center.

The introduction section must include the background, rationale, and urgency of the research, supported by theory and prior research findings (the state of the art). References are used to underscore the topic's importance and to demonstrate the connection between research problems and alternative solutions. Authors should also present a gap analysis identifying gaps in prior research that underpin the study and highlighting its novelty. The problem formulation, objectives, and benefits of the research are presented narratively without specific subheadings, and operational definitions are included if deemed necessary. In-text citations should include the author's name, year of publication, and the source's page number. This introductory section is recommended to comprise about 15–20% of the article's total length.

2. METHOD

The Research Method section contains the type of research, the time and place of the research, the subjects or research targets (population and sample), procedures, instruments, data analysis techniques, and other matters related to the implementation of the research. This section must be written in detail and comprehensively so that other researchers can replicate it. The proportion of this section is about 10–15% of the entire manuscript. The method can be written with subsections, using subheadings without numbering, in Times New Roman 12 pt font, not bold, and left-aligned. The explanation should include the research design, data collection techniques, data sources or participants, and data analysis techniques.

An explanation of the sample or subjects must be clear and include sampling techniques (quantitative) or subject selection techniques (qualitative). The research procedures are written according to the type of research, including how data is obtained, the types of instruments used, and how they are collected. Finally, the method for interpreting data in relation to the research problems and objectives must also be clearly explained.

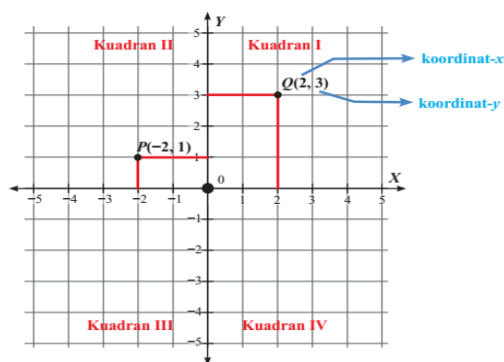
3. RESULT AND DISCUSSION

Contains a clear description of the study or research findings related to the problem formulation. Discussion of the study results/findings. For data presented in tables, use a table format like Table 1. The table should be titled in 11-point font. The title is placed above the table. The table is centered and referenced in the manuscript. If there is more than one table, then the tables are numbered, for example, Table 1, Table 2, and so on. Please do not use vertical lines in Table 1.

Tables and figures are centered horizontally and referenced in the manuscript. Figures are given titles, which are placed below the figures, as in Example Figure 1. If there is more than one figure, they are numbered sequentially, for example, Figure 1, Figure 2, and so on. The Results and Discussion section is the main part of the research article, comprising about 60–70% of the entire manuscript. This section briefly presents the main findings from the data analysis, accompanied by relevant tables or graphs, and focuses on the data that support the discussion. The discussion must be directly integrated with the data, answering the research problem or objectives, and related to broader theoretical contexts. Explanations should include reasons why certain facts appear in the data, as well as comparisons of findings with previous research results. The discussion can also generate new theories or modify existing ones, and explain the theoretical and practical implications of the research findings. Findings must be explicitly explained and supported by relevant citations.

4. CONCLUSION

The conclusion section is written in paragraph form, not in bullet points. It should be concise, clear, and not repeat the discussion or research findings. The conclusion must answer the research objectives or questions and reflect innovations or contributions to science. If necessary, relevant suggestions related to the research results can be added.

5. REFERENCES

All sources cited in the text must be listed in the reference list, arranged alphabetically in APA (American Psychological Association) format. It is recommended to use reference management applications such as **Mendeley, EndNote, or Zotero**. The references should preferably be scientific journal articles, not books, published within the past 10 years (since 2015). A minimum of 15 relevant sources related to the research topic is required. DOIs should be removed to avoid being mistaken for website links.
