It includes the background, objectives, methods, results, and conclusions of the research. The abstract does not contain references or display mathematical equations or uncommon abbreviations. The abstract consists of one paragraph with a maximum of 250 words (both in Indonesian and English).

Keywords: 3-5 keywords, separated by signs (;) and arranged alphabetically

INTRODUCTION

The background, methods, results and discussion, conclusions, and references are written in **Times New Roman s 12 pt font with 1.5 spacing**. The introduction contains the research background, literature review, and novelty supported by relevant theory. The introduction emphasizes the problem, urgency, uniqueness, and objectives of the research that will be further studied by the author/researcher. Uniqueness refers to the differences or distinctiveness of the research being conducted compared to other research that has been conducted previously.

RESEARCH METHODS

Methods are techniques for collecting, processing, and analyzing data. They include the method, time and location of the research, target/goal, research subjects, procedures, instruments, data analysis techniques, and other matters related to the research method.

RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

The results and discussion section contains the research findings and their discussion. List the findings obtained from the research conducted, which must be supported by adequate data. The results and findings should answer the research questions or hypotheses stated in the introduction. Discuss the findings by comparing existing opinions, perspectives, or research findings, whether they contradict or align with the research findings.

Recommendations for Further Research

Provide recommendations for further research.

CONCLUSION

The conclusion describes the answers to the research hypotheses and/or objectives, or the findings obtained. The conclusion does not contain a repetition of the results and discussion, but rather a summary of the findings as expected in the objectives or hypothesis.

Citation arrangement and bibliography style should be set automatically using *reference manager*, namely **Mendeley**.

Writing Guidelines in the Mawar Saron Journal

1. The article is neatly typed using *Times New Romans* font type. Margins (left: 4 cm, right, top and bottom: 3 cm) using type A4 paper.
2. Articles in good and correct Indonesian or English

3. The minimum article length is 15-20 pages.
4. The front page (*cover*) contains the title of the article, the author's name (without title), the institution's address and the abstract.
5. The title is written centered, capital letters, *Times New Romans*, in *bold*, and size 14.
6. Each table or figure should be numbered sequentially and given a title that reflects the table or figure's contents. The font type is *Times New Roman s* and size 10.
7. References are listed alphabetically by last name (without academic titles) for both foreign and Indonesian authors. Manuscripts that do not conform to Turabian 8 style will be returned to the author for correction. Authors are responsible for all information provided in their references.
8. Turnitin check result is 20%.
