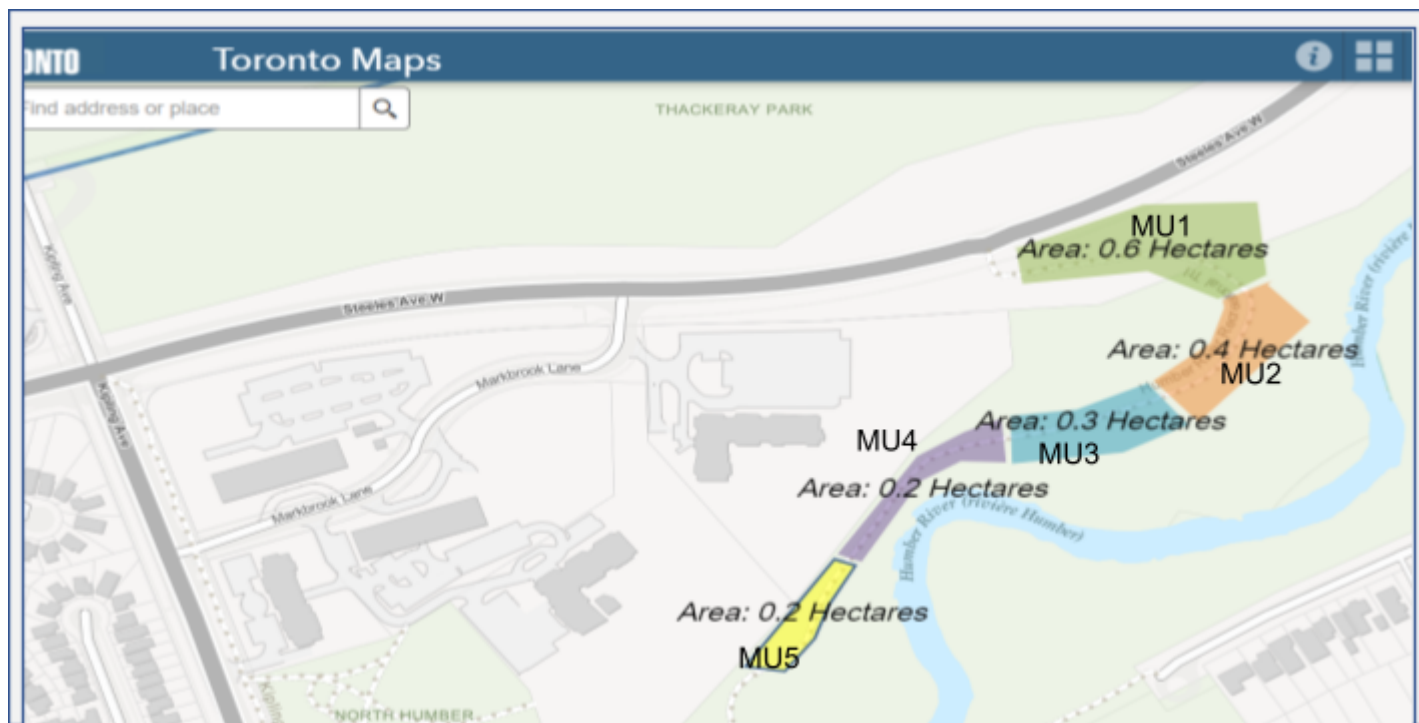
Site: Rowntree Mills Park

Joseph Rowntree was a pioneer in north Etobicoke village of Thistletown and established two mills on the banks of the Humber River. The park has many trails and co habitats of many small animals and birds.
