Introductory Information, CMPS 1500, Spring 2019

Textbook

We will be using online interactive learning environment Zybook, which is both a textbook and a programming environment. The cost to subscribe for one semester is 73\$:

- 1. Sign up at zyBooks.com with your Tulane email
- 2. Enter zyBook code TULANECMPS1500WenkSpring2019
- 3. Click Subscribe

The first graded homework will be assigned on the first day of class and will be due before the Wednesday lecture. Hence, it is important not to delay signing up for the book.

- If you receive financial aid for books and you are still waiting for it to arrive, you should write to the publisher and explain the situation. In the past they were able to give the students an opportunity to pay later.
- If you drop the class within the first few weeks of the semester, you can write to the publisher and receive a refund.
- You will only need the book for one semester, so buy only one-semester access.

Computers

We will not be using computers in the lectures (MWF). In fact, <u>the use of computers (and other</u> <u>electronics) in the lectures is not allowed to minimize distraction for the class, and to benefit from</u> <u>handwritten note-taking</u>.

We will be using computers in the labs on Thursday. You should bring a charged laptop to each lab.

- If you don't have a laptop, you will be able to work on a loaner laptop in lab and use shared campus computers or your desktop computer to complete homework. Not having a computer will not impact your progress in the course.
- It doesn't matter which operating system (Windows, MacOS, Linux, etc) your computer uses and what type of computer (Mac or PC) you have. But you need to work on a computer; a tablet such as an Ipad is not sufficient.

Software

Python

Starting with the first lab on Thursday, we will begin writing computer programs in a computer language called Python. You should download and install Python 3 before the lab: https://www.python.org/downloads/release/python-372/

• If you have problems during installation, don't worry, the TA will help you get set up during the lab

Behavior norms (verbatim from the University Policies)
