# Reading Notebook Expectations

### General Requirements / Organization

- Bring your notebook to <u>every</u> class
- Label each new entry with the title of your book and the date (unless directed otherwise)
- Write in pen or pencil ONLY

(Other tools such as markers, colored pencils, highlighters, etc can be used to flag important information or to create drawings/diagrams)

#### **Format Choices**

This year, you have the option to do notebook work in a composition book again **or** using a google doc (NEW!)

If you choose the google doc route, there will be a template to copy from schoology -- on Fridays you will simply need to submit your document on schoology.

If you decide to use a composition notebook you'll need to scan your pages each week and upload them onto schoology. You would also need to remember to bring your notebook home and back to school each day.

\*\*\* Improper computer use will result in being asked to work in your composition notebook \*\*\*

#### Daily Homework

- READ 30 minutes (outside of class)
- STOP + JOT in your journal (while you are reading)

#### Weekly Assessment

- Notebooks are <u>due each Friday</u>, submitted on Schoology
- During reading units, you will get feedback from me, on schoology each week
- I will not collect reading notebooks during writing units
- (When we shift to writing, requirements for reading will be less and my comments will shift to a writing focus.)


