## **Program Description**

The Bachelor of Divinity at HBIU University offers a comprehensive understanding of Christian theology, biblical studies, and ministry leadership, preparing students for careers in pastoral ministry, theological research, faith-based community leadership, and missions work. This program equips students with the tools to interpret scripture, understand church history, provide pastoral counseling, and engage in spiritual formation. Students will develop a deep knowledge of Christian doctrines and theological principles, with a focus on ethical decision-making, leadership, and practical ministry. The program also emphasizes cross-cultural engagement and prepares graduates to serve effectively in diverse ministry settings, addressing the needs of both local and global faith communities.

The program integrates faith-based leadership principles, helping students apply biblical teachings and ethical standards to modern ministry contexts. Students will explore various aspects of church leadership, such as preaching, worship, discipleship, and pastoral care, ensuring they are well-prepared to lead congregations and minister to individuals. The curriculum also provides opportunities for practical experience in ministry through internships, fieldwork, and community engagement, enabling students to develop the skills necessary for effective service in both local and international contexts.

The Minor in Leadership & Cultural Management focuses on understanding leadership dynamics in diverse cultural and faith-based environments. This minor is designed to equip students to navigate multi-faith and multicultural settings while leading effectively in global ministry and church administration. Students will explore topics such as cultural competence, interfaith dialogue, and leadership strategies that respect cultural differences. This minor prepares students to serve as leaders in diverse communities, providing them with the skills to manage cross-cultural ministries, foster unity in diversity, and adapt to the global challenges facing modern churches and faith-based organizations.
