Course Description

This 32-session (56-hour) course is an introduction to the fundamentals of music and the development of listening skills through the examination of popular western music, including its history, styles and significance in the realm of popular music. This is a discussion-based course meaning attendance is critically important (though content and discussion material will be available through Google Classroom). The purpose of the course is to give students the vocabulary and context to develop and defend cogent options and answer the question, "Why do you like that music? No musical background necessary. *Important: This course may involve mature content and language and families may opt out of content and discussions.

Course Objectives: Students will

- Evaluate and challenge personal aesthetics, biases, and modes of listening in music appreciation through discussion and journaling. Speaking and listening will be guided by <u>Common Core State</u> <u>Standards for English Language Arts</u>
- Understand <u>elements of music</u> including rhythm, tempo, meter, melody, harmony, form, and instrumentation.
- Analyze social, political, and historical context in music.
- Become familiar with specific composers and representative works of each style period.

Research Project

You will write a 3-page report on an artist/composer of your choice. This paper will include key influences, instrumentation and personnel, relevant history, significant contributions, and other information. Detailed instructions will be provided in Google Classroom.

You will create entries into your journal nearly every class period. I will give you general parameters from which to select listening samples. We will use this <u>template</u> for our entries.

You are expected to attend at least ONE musical event off campus throughout the semester. I will post weekly updates in Google Classroom regarding upcoming events. You may also check the Tempo in the Taos News for upcoming events. Note: Non-musical plays do not count for credit. You must bring a program from the event to receive credit. For events where a program is not provided, you must have a picture with YOU in attendance. If a student is caught taking extra programs for classmates, both students will fail the course, no questions asked. In addition to the event program or picture, you must provide a written reflection on your experience, to include as much relevant vocabulary as is necessary.
