## **PLC Meeting 10.8.2024**

- 1. Dr. Stanley updates:
  - a. Board meeting recap
    - i. Work Session
      - 1. EL programing report
        - a. Comments in the room: the way the family language report is administered is guided very clearly by the state (and the federal government) and sometimes frustrating for families or has unintended outcomes.
      - 2. Connect & Access feedback presented to the board.
    - ii. Regular Board Meeting (recorded if you want to review) highlights:
      - 1. Data Metrics plan.
      - Financial Literacy class (we have had a class offered with help from Edina grads and ed Fund, but now required): required by the state but required review of graduation requirements and needs.
      - Literacy: we are working to get everyone trained in LETRS, we are ahead of where we need to be for getting teachers trained.
      - 4. Approved some update policies, including new policy on SROs, and freedom of speech (as it relates to writing and newspapers).
    - iii. Shawnee Krueger: Lice
      - 1. Notifications when they have 3 reports of cases in a classroom.
      - 2. Nurses are looking and checking even if parents are reporting.
- Mert Woodard: Budget Presentation
  - a. Funding Overview in MN
    - i. Stated collected taxes
      - 1. Some are tied to specific needs
      - 2. Some are tied to specific categories
      - 3. Revenue = formula allowance x pupil units
        - a. Inflation is an issue, the floor is currently at 2%, but the cap is 3%.
        - b. CPI: \$7,281 adjusted pupil weighted change and inflation would be at \$8,637...would be about \$12.8M for the Edina district this year. A pupil is a pupil, regardless of open enrollment or resident enrollment.

- Local sources
  - 1. Property taxes
    - a. non -voter approved
    - b. Voter approved levy reliance
      - Operating referendum at 13.4% of total revenues; expires at the end of FY2026, could extend for 10 years without approval (the board would decide).
      - ii. Capital Projects Levy/Tech Levy 5.7% of total revenues.
  - 2. Local taxes, but the state determines the amount of taxing authority each district has.
- b. Edina Budget Realities
  - i. 2023 & 2024 "under funding" created structural imbalances; through BRRRG process. 2024 BRRG process was harder, largely due to pay inflation
- c. Budgeting Process
  - i. Taxes payable in 2025 4.87% overall levy increase
  - ii. Audited financial statements
  - iii. Review of-year forecast
    - 1. BRRRG?
    - 2. The update timeline is that these will be public by mid November, then BRRRG in the winter, with plans brought to the board in Feb/March.
  - iv. Board approves parameters fiscal year 2026
  - v. 2025 legislative session; funding
  - vi. Overall looking: we may not need a reduction this year, but we may need to start planning for reductions plans for the 2027 school year.

  - Refinancing in order to save interest (5.8-6M dollars hopefully saved)
