We have had a wonderful beginning to the school year! Our Welcome Back BBQ & Meet the Teacher evening, Parent Tea/OES 101 session, and the Welcome Back Assembly all helped set a positive, calm, and welcoming tone for students and families. We've received many compliments, and it truly feels like this year is off to a smooth and encouraging start. Thank you, School Council, for your assistance in making these events a success!

## Staffing & Class Sizes

As our school population continues to grow, we've worked closely with NGPS to make thoughtful staffing decisions that prioritize small class sizes and expanded learning opportunities.

This year, we welcomed:

- Two new homeroom teachers
- One teacher replacement
- A part-time reading interventionist
- A reassigned teacher as a part-time teacher-librarian and kindergarten,
- A full-time Phys. Ed. specialist
- A full-time Music specialist

#### These changes allow us to:

- Keep class sizes at an average of 18–22 students in K–3 and 23–28 students in grades 4–7
- Offer richer programming in literacy, library, music, and physical education
- Provide more targeted support by organizing our educational assistants into grade-level groups

To make this possible, we made small adjustments to our operational budget and slightly reduced the number of educational assistants, while creating additional homerooms and literacy support. The end result is more personalized attention for students and stronger programming across the school.

## **Building OES Pride**

We continue to foster school spirit by encouraging students and families to participate in school-wide events and wear OES spirit wear on **Wednesdays** and special occasions. Families can order OES swag through our online **URstore**, with items delivered directly to their homes.

## School Action Plan (Looking Ahead to 2026)

We are committed to student growth and wellness, and have set three exciting goals:

- 1. **Math** By June 2026, 90% of students will show measurable growth in math fluency (15% improvement from baseline scores).
- 2. **Literacy** By June 2026, at least 15% more students will meet or exceed grade-level expectations in reading and writing, supported by evidence-based instruction.

3. **Wellness** – By June 2026, student wellness will improve, with a 20% increase in positive self-reports on the annual wellness survey.
