South Central Calhoun will be utilizing Infinite Campus as a Student Information System. Please use the link below to begin the registration process for your preschool student. To begin, please click the button by “Start New Registration” and complete the prompts. Please make note of your application number in case you have any questions. Please keep the following in mind:

- Make note of your application number
- Items with a red asterisk are required
- The date of birth on the first page before accessing the application refers to the **date of birth of the adult completing the application.**
- At least one emergency contact is required
- You may try to complete the process using your cell phone, but it may work more smoothly using a computer
- You must complete the Hawk-I form if you DO NOT want the information.
- You may return the form to complete it later, especially if you like to add the completed forms.
- **PLEASE ONLY REGISTER YOUR PRESCHOOL AGED CHILDREN. Registration for other students will be coming in the next few months.**

After your registration has been processed, you will receive information about creating your Parent Portal account if you do not have one already where you can check lunch balances, grades, and pay online. More information about online pay will come in the future.

South Central Calhoun Three Year Old Program Facts:

Students must be three-years-old on or before September 15, 2026.

Students must be potty-trained. Potty Training Policy may be found on the SCC website.

This policy shall not be construed or applied in a way that violates the Individuals with Disabilities in Education Act or other applicable law.

Classes meet at both the SCC High School in Lake City and the SCC Elementary School in Rockwell City.

Students attend for 4 days a week (T, W, Th, F).

Morning classes meet from 8:00-11:00 in both Lake City and Rockwell City. Students who eat meals will arrive earlier and leave later. Afternoon classes meet from 12:45-3:45 in Lake City. There are no PM classes in Rockwell City.

Breakfast and lunch are provided only for children who are funded by Head Start. Students who eat breakfast and/or lunch at school must eat school meals. Bringing something from home is not permitted.

Tuition is \$200 per month for September-May. Eligible students can be funded by Head Start or receive a scholarship from Linking Families and Communities.

Transportation is provided on a limited basis. Transportation Policy is attached.

South Central Calhoun Four Year Old Program Facts:

Students must be four-years-old on or before September 15, 2026.

Students must be potty-trained. Potty Training Policy may be found on the SCC website.

This policy shall not be construed or applied in a way that violates the Individuals with Disabilities in Education Act or other applicable laws.

Classes meet at both the SCC High School in Lake City and the SCC Elementary School in Rockwell City.

Students attend for 4 days a week (T, W, Th, F).

Morning classes meet from 8:00-11:00 in both Lake City and Rockwell City. Students who eat meals will arrive earlier and leave later. Afternoon classes meet from 12:10-3:10 in Rockwell City and 12:45-3:45 in Lake City.

Breakfast and lunch are provided only for children who are funded by Head Start. Students who eat breakfast and/or lunch at school must eat school meals. Bringing something from home is not permitted.

There is no tuition. Students are funded either by Head Start or by the State.

Transportation is provided for according to the enclosed policy.

Registration Checklist:

Do NOW to guarantee a spot:

- ☐ Use the link on page one to complete preschool registration by April 1st.

Next steps:

- ☐ You will receive a letter in May verifying your child's enrollment and assigned section.
- ☐ Teachers will be in contact with you in August to schedule a classroom visit.

Due prior to the first day of school:

- ☐ Turn in a copy of your child's birth certificate if he/she hasn't previously attended SCC.
- ☐ Turn in proof of a recent physical if not already on file at school. The physical must have been within the last calendar year. Please ask your physician to use this [Form](#). This must be turned in before the first day of school.
- ☐ Turn in proof of a recent dental screening on the State's [required form](#). The screening must have been within the last calendar year, and the form must be turned in prior to the first day of school.
- ☐ Provide a valid certificate of immunization with up-to-date immunizations as required by Iowa schedule. This must be turned in before the first day of school.
- ☐ Families of students who are funded by Head Start will have additional paperwork to complete with the Head Start Family Advocate.

* No child will be allowed to start preschool in the fall without a physical form, dental form, and immunization record on file at the school. Please make your appointments accordingly.

SCC Transportation Guidelines

The SCC District recognizes that transportation can be a barrier to a child's attendance at school. District personnel will work to minimize that barrier by providing transportation to eligible students according to these guidelines.

3-year-old preschool students are eligible for district transportation if (1) their residence is on an existing rural or shuttle route or (2) they have an IEP which requires special transportation services. Out-of-district students of families that open-enroll to SCC will be determined on a case-by-case basis. District-provided transportation for IEP students will be determined by the IEP team.

4-year-old preschool students are eligible for district transportation if (1) their residence or designated address is more than 2 miles from their attendance building but within the boundaries of the district, or (2) transportation is included in the *Individualized Education Plan (IEP)*. Out-of-district students of families that open-enroll to SCC will be eligible for transportation on a case-by-case basis. District-provided transportation for rural students will consist of pick-up and drop-off at one specified and consistent location. District-provided transportation for in-town and shuttle routes will consist of pick-up and drop-off at specified locations, those being the museum and post office in Rockwell City, the library in Lohrville, the gazebo in Lytton, and either Central School or the corner of Michigan and Madison Street in Lake City. Class placement and transportation availability will depend on enrollment.
