<b>*Learning Continuity and Attendance Plan:</b> A learning continuity and attendance plan adopted pursuant to this section <b>shall be posted</b> consistent with the requirements of Sections 52065 and 47606.5.	<a href="#">EC 43509(d)</a>	Prominently posted on the district's internet homepage.
<b>*LCAP Federal Addendum:</b> <b>Prominently post on the homepage of the internet website</b> of the school district any local control and accountability plan approved by the governing board of the school district and any updates, revisions, or addenda, including those to comply with federal law, to a local control and accountability plan approved by the governing board of the school district.	<a href="#">EC 52065(a)(1)</a>	Prominently post on the district's internet homepage.
<b>*Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) Prompts: Posted within LCAP.</b>	<a href="#">EC 52065(a)(1)</a> <a href="#">CDE CSI Prompts webpage</a>	
<b>Local Control and Accountability Plans (LCAPs):</b> <b>Prominently post on the homepage of the internet website</b> of the school district any LCAP approved by the governing board of the school district, and any updates or revisions to a LCAP approved by the governing board of the school district. <b>Prominently post all LCAPs submitted by charter schools that were authorized by the school district, or links to those plans, on the internet website of the school district.</b>	<a href="#">EC 52065</a> <a href="#">EC 47606.5</a>	Prominently post on the district's internet homepage. <b>Note:</b> For the 2020-21 school year, LEAs were required to complete the Learning Continuity and Attendance Plan in place of the LCAP.
<b>*LCAPs of charter schools authorized by the school district:</b> <b>Prominently post</b> all local control and accountability plans submitted by charter schools that were authorized by the school district, or links to those plans, <b>on the internet website of the school district.</b>	<a href="#">EC 52065(a)(2)</a>	Prominently post on the district's internet homepage.

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<b>Sex Equity in Education Act (Title IX):</b> The requirements of Title IX must be posted in a “ <b>prominent and conspicuous location</b> ” on the internet website. Must post the designated Title IX coordinator, the rights of students and responsibilities of schools, and a description of how to file a complaint.	FPM: EE 04 <a href="#">EC 221.61</a>	Post in a prominent and conspicuous location. Applies to public schools, private schools that receive federal funds.
<b>Sex Equity in Education Act (Gender Participation in Sports):</b> Applicable to each public elementary school, secondary school, and charter school offering competitive athletics <b>shall be posted on the internet</b> and listed by individual school.	FPM: EE 09 <a href="#">EC 221.9[c]</a> , <a href="#">EC 221.9[d]</a>	Applies to each public elementary and secondary school in the state, including each charter school that offers competitive athletics.
<b>School Accountability Report Card (SARC):</b> <b>Must be accessible on the internet.</b> Must also notify parents or guardians of students that a hard copy will be provided upon request. It is the intent of the Legislature that schools make a concerted effort to notify parents of the purpose of the SARC and ensure: all parents receive a copy; that the report cards are easy to read and understandable by parents; LEAs with access to the Internet make current copies available through the Internet; and that administrators and teachers are available to answer any questions regarding the report cards. Section 6311[h][2][B][iii] EC 35256[c] <a href="#">EC 35258</a> <a href="#">EC 33126</a>	Applies to all California public & nonpublic, nonsectarian schools.
<b>Special Education Plans:</b> The superintendent or other chief administrator of a local educational agency <b>shall post on the Internet Web site</b> of the local educational agency any local plan, annual budget plan, annual service plan, and annual assurances support plan upon approval of the special education local plan area, and any updates or revisions to the plans upon approval of the special education local plan area.	<a href="#">EC 56205.5</a>	Applies to all LEAs.
<b>Healthy Schools Act:</b> <b>Develop and post</b> the Integrated Pest Management Plan on the school website (or the school district if the school does not maintain a website). If neither the school nor district maintains a website, send an annual notification to staff and parent/guardians.	<a href="#">EC 17611.5</a>	Applies to all schools.
<b>Mathematics Placement Policy:</b> Each governing board or body of a local educational agency shall ensure that its mathematics placement policy is <b>posted on its Internet Web site.</b>	<a href="#">EC 51224.7</a>	Applies to school districts, state special schools & charter schools.

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<b>Expanded Day Programs:</b> Public notification of evaluation results of expanded day programs. Also, documentation showing pupils and grades served and hours, days of operation, and program elements. For FPM, item instructions state, "Upload documentation that the evaluation results have been publicly posted. <b>Include when and how the notice was posted, the Web page</b> and how the evaluation results can be obtained."	FPM: EXLP 04, EXLP 12, EXLP 20 20 U.S.C. Section 7175 [b][1]-[2]	Requirement is for public notification. EXLP 04 and 20 provide the web posting as an option. Item instructions for EXLP 12 appear to require web posting.
<b>Request for Interdistrict Transfer:</b> Each school district of residence and school district of proposed enrollment <b>shall post on its Internet Web site</b> the procedures and timelines, including a link to the policy of the governing board of the school district, regarding a request for an interdistrict transfer permit in a manner that is accessible to the public without a password. The information posted on the Internet Web site and shall include all required details.	<a href="#">EC 46600.2</a>	
<b>School District of Choice:</b> A school district of choice shall post application information <b>on its Internet Web site</b> . This information shall include, at a minimum, any applicable form and the timeline for a transfer and an explanation of the selection process.	<a href="#">EC 48301</a>	
<b>Citizens' Oversight Committee:</b> All citizens' oversight committee proceedings shall be open to the public and notice to the public shall be provided in the same manner as the proceedings of the governing board of the district. Minutes and all documents received and reports issued shall be a matter of public record and be made available <b>on an Internet Web site</b> maintained by the governing board of the district.	<a href="#">EC 15280</a>	
<b>Establishment of Charter Schools:</b> The department shall develop a notice of the requirements of this paragraph. This notice shall be <b>posted on a charter school's internet website</b> . A charter school shall provide a parent or guardian, or a pupil if the pupil is 18 years of age or older, a copy of this notice when a parent, guardian, or pupil inquires about enrollment, before conducting an enrollment lottery, and before disenrollment of a pupil.	<a href="#">EC 47605</a>	Charter Schools only

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<b>WASC:</b> If a school loses its accreditation status, the school district shall notify each parent or guardian of the pupils in the school that the school has lost its accreditation status, in writing, and this notice shall indicate the potential consequences of the school's loss of accreditation status. This notice shall also be <b>posted on the school district's Internet Web site and the school's Internet Web site</b> , if any. The school shall publish all results of any inspection of the school by the accrediting agency not later than 60 days after the results are made available to the school. Results may be published in writing or website.	<a href="#">EC 35178.4</a>	Notification to each parent or guardian.
<b>*Governing board meetings for entities managing charters:</b> For a governing body of an entity that manages two or more charter schools that are not located in the same county, the governing body of the entity managing the charter schools shall...shall audio record, video record, or both, all the governing board meetings and <b>post the recordings on each charter school's internet website</b> .	<a href="#">EC 47604.1(c)(4)(C)</a>	Charter Schools only
<b>*Charter school enrollment requirements:</b> A charter school shall not discourage a pupil from enrolling or seeking to enroll in the charter school for any reason, including, but not limited to, academic performance of the pupil or because the pupil exhibits any of the characteristics described...The department shall develop a notice of the requirements of this paragraph. This notice shall be <b>posted on a charter school's internet website</b> . A charter school shall provide a parent or guardian, or a pupil if the pupil is 18 years of age or older, a copy of this notice at all of the following times: (i) When a parent, guardian, or pupil inquires about enrollment. (ii) Before conducting an enrollment lottery. (iii) Before disenrollment of a pupil.	<a href="#">EC 47605(e)(4)(D)</a>	Charter Schools only
<b>HOMELESS Information:</b> District must post 1) contact information for their homeless coordinator; 2) summary of training provided to their homeless coordinator; 3) rights and resources of homeless students. * note that an annual housing survey is not required.	<a href="#">AB27</a>	

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<b>Required notification, internet as option</b>		
<b>Williams Complaint Policy &amp; Procedure:</b> Requires school districts to use a modified uniform complaint process to help identify and resolve deficiencies related to instructional materials, emergency or urgent facilities conditions that pose a threat to the health and safety of students or staff, and teacher vacancy or misassignment. Allows for the filing of anonymous complaints. A complainant who identifies himself or herself is entitled to a response upon request.	<a href="#">EC 35186</a>	The internet is an option for posting.
<b>Child Find:</b> Each SELPA shall establish written policies and procedures for a continuous child find system. The policies and procedures shall include, but need not be limited to, written notification of all parents of their rights under this chapter, and the procedure for initiating a referral for assessment to identify individuals with exceptional needs. A LEA may place a current copy of the procedural safeguards notice on its website.	<a href="#">EC 56301</a> 20 U.S.C. Section 1415(d)(1)(B)	May place current copy of the procedural safeguards notice on its website (not required).
<b>Access to Pupil Mental Health Services:</b> A school of a school district or county office of education and a charter school shall notify pupils and parents or guardians of pupils no less than twice during the school year on how to initiate access to available pupil mental health services on campus or in the community, or both – using at least two methods (i.e., electronic or hardcopy letter, parent handbook, or web posting).	<a href="#">EC 49428</a>	Use of two methods is required. Web posting is one available option.
<b>Employee Code of Conduct:</b> A local educational agency, or a person, firm, association, partnership, or corporation offering or conducting private school instruction at the elementary or high school level, that maintains a section on employee interactions with pupils in its employee code of conduct shall provide to the parent or guardian of each enrolled pupil, a written copy and post the section on employee interactions with pupils in its code of conduct, or provide a link to it, on each of its schools' Internet Web sites.	<a href="#">EC 44050</a>	Provide a written copy to each parent/guardian or provide a link to the website.
<b>Child Hunger Prevention and Fair Treatment Act:</b> The district must notify parents, students and staff of the Meal Charge Policy on how students who pay the full or reduced price cost of a reimbursable meal are impacted by having insufficient funds on hand or in their accounts to purchase a meal. Districts are encouraged to include the policy in student handbooks or website.	<a href="#">EC 49557.5</a>	Encouraged to include the policy on a website.

<b>Uniform Complaint Procedures (UCP):</b> UCP Annual Notice may be posted on the LEA web site, but must, in addition, be distributed to all employees, students, parents/guardians, advisory committee members, private school officials (if any) and other interested parties with access thereof in a tangible format.	FPM: UCP EC 8235.5 (preschool)	Distribution requirement: “May be posted to the LEA website.”
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Notification to inform pupils, parents/guardians, or staff regarding content available on the internet		
<b>Meals for Needy Pupils in K-12:</b> If a governing board of a school district, a county office of education, or a school food authority chooses to provide access to an online application for free or reduced-price meals, the online application shall comply with specific requirements.	<a href="#">EC 49557</a>	If application is online.
<b>Annual Notification (College/Career):</b> Required pursuant to Section 48980, a district offering any of grades 9 to 12, shall provide the parent or guardian with written notification that, to the extent possible, shall not exceed one page in length and that includes specific information regarding college admission requirements, including the Internet address for the portion of the Web site of the department where pupils can learn more about courses meeting a-g subject requirements, college admission, and career technical education.	<a href="#">EC 51229</a>	Requirement to include internet address in notification to parents/guardians of pupils in grades 9-12.
<b>Safe Place to Learn Act (Cyber Sexual Bullying):</b> School districts are encouraged to inform pupils of the information and resources on the Internet Web sites regarding dangers and consequences of cyber sexual bullying to help reduce the instances of cyber sexual bullying.	<a href="#">EC 234.2</a>	Notification requirement: To inform pupils of the internet resources on the California Healthy Kids Resource Center Website.
<b>Sudden Cardiac Arrest:</b> Each school year, before a pupil participates in an athletic activity governed by the California Interscholastic Federation (CIF), the school shall collect and retain a copy of the sudden cardiac arrest information sheet required by the CIF for that pupil. Before a pupil participates in an athletic activity not governed by the CIF, the pupil and the pupil’s parent or guardian shall sign and return an acknowledgment of receipt and review of the information sheet posted on the California Department of Education’s Internet Web site after July 1, 2017.	<a href="#">EC 33479</a> <i>et seq.</i>
