Key Questions: TLDR ver.

- What were the Americas like prior to Columbus?
 - Attuned with nature
 - no need for exploration
 - incredible survival skills
 - diverse, no one true thing to pin them down on,
 - participated in farming, hunting, and nomadic behavior
- What motivated European exploration?
 - GOLD, GOD, GLORY, LAND
 - Age of exploration
 - More accessible equipment (like maps via printing press)
 - Accounts of successful voyages
 - Population growth
 - Economy goes down
 - Mercantilism
 - People started replacing their farms with land for sheep so they could harvest the wool for the then booming textile industry
 - Religion
 - Protestant Reformation -> Puritans escaping Britain to explore their own version of Christianity
 - Civilizing Missions (in the 16th-20th century as a way to justify imperialism)

Key People: TLDR ver.

Consider the Source - People of note:

Bartolome De Las Casas "Of the island of hispaniola"

- Marked tales of European Abuse towards Native Americans
- Advocated for fair treatment of native americans

Christopher Columbus - From Genoa Italy

- Originally looking for a trade route to India for spices
- Believed the world to be smaller than it actually was
- Reached mainland America on 3rd voyage
- Funded by Spain

- His plans of exploration came to an end leaving him obscure and unknown

Vasco De Gama

- First to establish a full sea route from Europe to India

Hernando Cortes

- Spanish Conquistador who played a massive role in the downfall of the Aztec civilization
- Established Local Caste system in Colonies

Montezuma

- The Aztec Emperor who was in rule during Hernan Cortes's voyages and the peak of the Aztec civilization
- Captured by Hernan Cortes and used as a puppet leader

Key Places: TLDR ver.

Olmec

Tenochtitlan - Capitol of Aztec

Jamestown - First successful settlement in America

- In Virginia;
- Virginia named after the Virgin Queen Elizabeth

Key Events: (in no particular order) TLDR ver.

- Columbian Exchange
 - Note: the Columbian exchange isn't his journey to the Americas, it's the transfer of livestock, crops, and pathogens from the old world to the new world
- The Great Dying
 - In which Pathogens wiped out about 60-80 million native Americans (~90%)
 - Native Americans didn't have the foresight not to stick around the sick and would infect each other with the **Flu**, **Measles**, **Typhus**, and **Smallpox**
- Capture of Tenochtitlan
 - Aztecs believed the Europeans (Hernan Cortes) was a god from a prophecy and welcomed him (and their rival tribe) in without hesitation
 - Ended up getting their butts handed to them and was easily taken over
 - Encomienda System
 - Slavery/Indentured Servitude in return for protection and food
 - Many people died of disease
 - Montezuma served as a puppet leader for Europeans
