

Measure 2 is a statutory citizen-initiated measure that will appear on North Dakota's 2022 general election ballot. [Read the full text of the measure here.](#)

What the measure does

- Permits adults 21 years of age or older to possess and purchase up to:
 - One ounce of cannabis flower;
 - Four grams of cannabis concentrate; and/or
 - 500 milligrams of THC in the form of an infused cannabis product;
- Allows adults to cultivate up to three cannabis plants in a secured location on private property that is not viewable from the public;
- Establishes a regulatory system for cannabis businesses overseen by the North Dakota Dept. of Health and Human Services or another agency designated by the legislature;
- Directs regulators to implement an adult-use cannabis program no later than October 1, 2023;
- Limits the number of cannabis registrations such that there are no more than seven manufacturing facilities and no more than eighteen dispensaries in the state;
- Prohibits a single person or business from owning more than one manufacturing facility or more than four dispensaries;
- Requires all cannabis products to be tested by a state-approved laboratory for safety and potency; and
- Protects individuals from loss of parental rights for the lawful use of cannabis.

What the measure does not do

- Establish a cannabis-specific tax (though normal sales taxes will apply to cannabis);
- Require employers to change their workplace drug use policies; or
- Permit public consumption of cannabis.
