For terms # 1-83 (General Concept, Geography, Political Systems and Economic Systems) you must include at least <u>ONE</u> example of the definition and this example <u>MUST</u> come from World History and <u>CANNOT come from U.S. History.</u>

Example #1: **Cultural Diffusion** – the exchange of ideas, technology and customs from one area to another. Cultural Diffusion occurs when people interact with one another through trade, migration and/or warfare. An example of cultural diffusion is the Columbian Exchange. The Columbian Exchange was the vast trading system that was a result of Columbus' voyages where people, plants, animals, ideas, and diseases were passed from the Eastern Hemisphere (Old World) to the Western Hemisphere (New World) and vice versa.

For terms # 84-100 (Belief Systems), you must include the belief system's founder (if applicable), main beliefs and/or practices.

Example #2: Islam – A monotheistic religion founded by the Prophet Muhammad in Mecca in 622 CE. This religion spread from the Arabian Peninsula to northern Africa, Asia Minor, southwest Asia (the Middle East), south Asia (Pakistan), southeast Asia, and areas in southeast Europe(Balkans). This religion's main beliefs include: the Five Pillars of Faith (Confession of Faith, Prayer 5 times a day, Alms Giving, Fasting during Ramadan and the Hajj to Mecca).
