Hopkinton Senior Center Medical Appointments - Volunteer Driver Program (not available to those living in private care facilities)	Our volunteer driver program is available to Hopkinton residents age 60 and older for trips to medical appointments in the MetroWest area during business hours Monday through Friday. This is a door to door free service. Riders must be able to transfer into a private vehicle independently. You will need to share the trip details including date, time, duration and location. Metrowest Regional Transit Authority (MWRTA)	MWRTA is responsible for fixed bus routes and para-transit routes, which mimic the normal bus routes, but provide a smaller bus with lift capability for the disabled and physically challenged individual. Paratransit transportation is a shared ride, origin to destination service required by the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).
