Camps: If you qualify and are interested in applying to camps (at no cost to you), you must complete this form to enroll at the link [here](#). A completed form does NOT guarantee a slot in camp, but will be shared with the camp. Once we have your information, camps can enroll you in camp starting now.

At the April 9th Camp Fair, you will have the opportunity to meet camp staff and hear about their programs and dates. You will have access to 1-4 weeks of camps on a first come first serve basis. After that, we will allocate camp spots as needed. Those families that meet income guidelines can enroll between March 15- May 6, 2022. From May 6th- May 15th, camp spots are open to ALL families in PPS. Applications will close on May 15.
