SOCIAL EMOTIONAL LEARNING:
Currently within our Second Step SEL
curriculum, your child may be learning
about how to successfully solve an
interpersonal problem by picking a solution

that's safe, respectful, and can work for everyone involved. Try this at home: Talk with your child about a time when they were able to solve a problem with a safe and respectful solution that worked for everyone involved. Describe a time when you did the same. Point out that solving problems may not always be easy, but it's worth the effort.

I hope your family finds these talking points beneficial.



ARRIVAL/DISMISSAL PROCEDURES

We have ongoing discussions with the City and District office to determine the best solution.

This link is our <u>Safe Routes to School Map</u> that shows potential streets to park and walk from within our neighborhood. In the last assessment and evaluation from the City of Fremont, it was determined that 66% of our families live within ½ mile of campus and nearly 100% of families are within a mile (20 minute walk).

Please review the protocols below that will help the Kinderloop function more safely and efficiently:

Drop-off Procedures:

- Drivers must pull all the way forward, have the child exit the right side of the vehicle quickly and safely, and wait for the line to move forward.
- Backpacks or other materials should not be left in the trunk of the car as it is dangerous for students to go behind the vehicle. Please ensure students have all materials in their seat and take the materials as they exit.
- Drivers will only be permitted to make a right turn from Parkside Drive into the loop. Upon exit, drivers will only be allowed to turn right onto Parkside Drive.

- The loop will have only one lane. Drivers will not be able to pass vehicles to exit, and cars that are holding traffic will be directed to exit the loop.
- If a student does walk to campus from the Mowry side, please turn right and follow the sidewalk around the Kinderloop instead of crossing in front of the loop where cars are entering.

Pick-up Procedures:

- During pick-up time, drivers should enter the loop based on their students' grade. Drivers will not be able to remain in the loop to pick up students from different dismissals, cars waiting for passengers will be directed to leave and return.
 - 1st-3rd grade: enter before/at the 2:35pm dismissal; enter after 1:37pm on Wednesdays
 - 4-6th grade: enter no sooner than 2:45pm; enter before/at the 1:15pm dismissal on Wednesdays
- During pick-up time, pull forward in line and let students come to you.
- Drivers should remain in their car, as over 900 students are all departing at the same time. Our staff will work diligently to get the students out to the car quickly and safely.
- Our staff have designated parking spaces; please refrain from parking or blocking their reserved spots.
- Do not park your vehicle in the traffic loop. Visitors to the campus will need to park along the street and walk in.
- Accessible visitor/handicap parking will only be available to those with valid placards.

Again, on behalf of Parkmont staff, we appreciate your cooperation and collaboration, with safety at the forefront of all decision making. We hope to have a successful and efficient traffic loop if everyone does their part.

FUSD SAFETY REMINDERS

Dear FUSD families,

As a reminder, it is extremely important that if your student is exhibiting the following symptoms please keep your child home and get tested. Symptoms include:

- New loss of taste/smell
- Difficulty breathing
- Vomiting
- Diarrhea
- Fever (100 or higher)
- Cough
- Severe headache
- Sore throat

Also linked here is the ACPH guidance for your reference. If you have any other questions please feel free to contact the school office, and if your child will be absent, please report the absence. If you have tested your child, please wait until you have results before you send your child to school. If they test positive, please keep your child home and follow the attached process.
