Executive Committee and Conference Committee Guidelines for Annual State Conference Registration and Hotel Stay Paid by ASAP-NJ

Beginning January 1, 2009:

1. All Executive Committee and Annual State Conference Committee members are responsible for paying their annual ASAP-NJ Membership fee (with the exception of the Past President).
2. ASAP-NJ will pay conference registration and 2 nights hotel room for:

- a. All Annual State Conference Committee members. A list of Annual State Conference Committee members shall be submitted to the Executive Board by November 30, each year.
- b. Any Executive Committee member or their designee that has participated in at least 4 Executive Committee meetings during the prior ASAP-NJ fiscal year (January 1 – December 31). For example, the Regional Chair participates in 4 Executive Committee meetings (2 in person, 2 via teleconference) from January 1, 2008 to December 31, 2008. That Regional Chair may attend the 2009 Annual Conference, and ASAP-NJ will pay for their registration and 2 night hotel.

(Changes in Regional Chair during any 12 month time period will follow the above guide except 4 Executive Committee Meetings may have been attended by 2 separate individuals).

3. In order for ASAP-NJ to pay conference registration and 2 nights hotel room for the above, the Annual State Conference Chairperson must be notified in writing by November 30 or the year prior to the Annual State Conference date. Any Executive Committee member that specifies a designee must notify the Annual State Conference Chairperson in writing as to the name of the designee by November 30 of the year prior to the Annual State Conference.
4. Travel to and from the conference and additional meals are not included, and will not be reimbursed by ASAP-NJ.
5. Applications for exceptions to any of the aforementioned must be made in writing to the Annual State Conference Chairperson by November 30 of the year prior to the Annual State Conference.

#### **Position Statement on Drug Testing in Schools**

The United States Supreme Court ruled in July of 2002 to allow random drug testing for secondary school students participating in extracurricular and other privileged activities. The Association of Student Assistance Professionals of New Jersey (ASAP-NJ) and the National Student Assistance Association (NSAA) believe parents/guardians and educators must decide at the local level if random drug testing is an appropriate tool to address student drug use in their schools and neighborhoods. If schools choose to use random drug testing, it is essential that a comprehensive student assistance program (SAP) with a Substance Awareness Coordinator is in place in the school district. In its publication, "Drug Testing in Schools," the Office of National Drug Control Policy (ONDCP) recognizes student assistance programs as a positive referral option for students identified through random drug testing. Schools that have student assistance programs in place play a positive role in ensuring that students receive appropriate support, referral and follow-up.

### Notes from the Meeting and Action Steps

The agenda for the meeting included updates on DSACS and SECD, review and feedback on the on-line credentialing course for SECD, the DSACS web site, SECD and higher education, ways to create more synergistic connections of DSACS/SECD with Stakeholder Partners, and an introduction to the Alliance for SECD. While it may sound like an all-day meeting, we accomplished our goals in an hour and a half. We were helped by the hospitality of FEA and Chuck Stein's generous provision of marvelous snacks. Those of you who missed the meeting definitely missed some wonderful food and camaraderie.

Present at the meeting were Chuck Stein (NJPSA), Janet Tisdale (NJEA), Joanne MacLennan (College of St. Elizabeth), Gary Vermeire (NJDOE), Paula Bloom (NJDOE), Barry Barbarasch (NJASP), Natercia Rendeiro (NJASW), Jacqueline Norris (TCNJ and DSACS Leadership Team), John Bulina (NJSBA), Donna Snyder (DSACS Director of Field Services), Kate Conner (DSACS Regional Implementation Staff Member, South Team)

### Updates on DSACS and SECD

- DSACS has funding for years 4 and 5, through June 2010, with the possibility of continued funding; schools can be confident in establishing relationships with us. Our focus this year is: continuing to build momentum with our 193 current schools and working with additional 60 schools in a research capacity to determine outcomes of the project (which tier/service delivery model is most effective). We will include academic data, school report card data, climate data, violence and vandalism, etc. We look forward to scaling up, but beforehand, we need to determine which intervention/consultation approaches are most effective to focus on, based on outcomes.

- This year, we are offering Principles of Coordination workshops to help recruit schools into DSACS, and Putting Children First workshops, that are available to anyone, whether involved with DSACS or not. Some of the latter are focused on Service Learning, a key DSACS theme. The workshop calendar is available at [www.teachSECD.com](http://www.teachSECD.com).

ACTION STEP: Please be sure your association members are aware of the DSACS training opportunities. We will continue to add more workshops right after the New Year.

- We are continuing to work with all organizations- CEP, CASEL, NASP, and Edutopia, nationally, and our various partners in NJ. DSACS was represented at many statewide and regional conferences and meetings and in stakeholders' newsletters and web sites. This will continue over the next two years, most recently in the *School Leader*, NJSBA's publication reaching all of its members.
- Introduction of SECD reference guide. At the national CEP conference, SECD was clearly alive and well. The link of SEL and Character Education as SECD was a "hot topic" with SRO participation on Sunday morning the last day of the conference. At CEP, National Professional Resources ([www.nprinc.com](http://www.nprinc.com)) introduced an outstanding SECD resource, a brief, laminated 6-page SECD reference card. Copies of mock-ups were distributed to attendees along with ordering information. This card may be the best tool yet to introduce teachers, administrators, and parents to SECD in an accessible, practical, yet comprehensive way. CEP also gave all attendees a copy of Performance Values: Why They Matter and What Schools Can Do to Foster Their Development (cf. [www.character.org](http://www.character.org)), a document that makes clear linkages of SEL and character education in a way that is SECD by another name. It was also noted that CASEL is in hibernation mode due to a focus on helping meet Illinois mandates regarding SEL.

ACTION STEP:

Joanne asked which SECD programs are being used by DSACS schools; we have no current database for this but we will work on assembling it. It can be very useful in our networking efforts.

#### Online credentialing course and process

- All Stakeholders were provided a copy of the current version of the Level 1 credentialing course, for the Instruction of SECD in classrooms and small groups, including after school programming. Following Stakeholder review, a draft will be created for review by NJDOE; Rutgers also must review and approve the course structure.
- Jackie Norris, one of the primary course developers, along with Vicki Poedubicky of the Highland Park Public Schools and a DSACS Mentor/Consultant, provided a brief rationale and background. Questions arose as to the type of course or credentialing program it should be; at this point, it is a compromise between a master's level type course and a workshop/in-service training. It balances theory and pragmatics and requires a demonstration of the skill prior to credentialing. The credential is structured around 3 course experiences: 1-building a knowledge base, foundation, of what SECD is and is not. 2- focusing on practice and pedagogy and conveying what SECD looks like via applications and examples, videos, etc. 3- a supervised practicum component, involving developing and working on a plan to carry out SECD instruction
- It was universally recommended that the SECD instruction include personal meetings, ideally at the beginning and during the practicum component.
- The courses are for any professional who works with kids and wants to increase SECD in their work; it can be used for hiring purposes, to ensure that prospective staff members have the qualifications to implement SECD in classrooms and small groups in and after school.
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**An open discussion raised the following questions that the DSACS team will work to answer:**

How will this really be implemented?

What about cost?

How will professional associations actively encourage it?

How will you show that this credential gives added value, from the perspective of teachers, administrators, school boards, student support personnel?

How can you get teachers excited?

How can we make it part of pre-service curriculum? Jackie: higher levels are more geared toward higher ed. Admin. And teacher preparatory programs. It is attractive for mental health professionals, but there is no track for school social workers in pre-service training.

Consider what qualifies someone as school social worker? Psychologist? Counselor? SAC? Etc. How does SECD fit into qualifications and how can it better fit into formal qualifications?

How can professions better integrate existing and forthcoming SECD tools into their practices?

ACTION STEPS: I invite everyone to provide thoughts about the specifics of the above questions, especially those involving SECD and professional associations. Meanwhile, the following action steps seem most appropriate, based on the meeting conversation:

ACTION STEP: I would like representatives of each professional association linked to DSACS, including those not present at the meeting, to create a 30-second elevator speech (you can tape it or write it or both) that answers a question raised at the meeting, "How does SECD fit into my professional role? Why should I care about it?" Please send these to Maurice by the beginning of January. Thank you!

ACTION STEP: Gary suggested that associations could consider coming to the Board of Credentialing as *one* voice, encouraging them to look at preparatory requirements- upgrading them, etc. It may be the first time that people advocate for SECD all together; there is real potential. It was suggested that a first step would be DSACS presentations to two key groups:

LEE (Leadership for Educational Excellence, composed of NJPSA, NJASA (Superintendents), NJASBO (School Business Officials), NJEA, NJSBA (School boards), PTA, Dep't of Educ.) and COCST (composed of NJASP, NJSCA, NJASW, ASAPNJ, possibly others...). The action step is to ask for your help in making these arrangements. I believe Natercia, Chuck and Janet mentioned that they would follow up on this.

Additional questions were raised regarding the on-line structure of the course:

How long do courses run? Topics? Also, what are my weekly obligations? What is the format? Will individuals have avatars that respond? Will there be a chat room situation, allowing one to be online with others taking the course?

Jackie replied with our current thinking: 10 hours/course; 2 hours/topic. Discussion boards as well as chat times will be utilized, with a moderator. The courses will be self-paced in that there are reflections, downloads, drop boxes for "homework". In the pilot program, the second round was more self-paced which was better received than the first round (participants did not like the idea of homework). We hope to offer the courses on a more frequent basis, and provide a structure for a cohort of students going through the course, to create community and networking. Rutgers will host the courses but we must attend to the bandwidth of the course as we think about streaming video components, chatting, etc. It was noted that commitment, duration, and obligations all must be specific and clear.

What other courses are being planned? Next in development is our Level 3 credential, designed to help people work with a school to organize its SECD programming; supervisors, directors and principals may not have the training to put these efforts together and this will be a value-added skill across disciplines.

Comments were gathered about the course structure, including written feedback, and these are all being worked on by the development team.

#### DSACS Web Site

Stakeholders were invited to examine the DSACS web site, [www.teachSECD.com](http://www.teachSECD.com), and provide feedback. Overall feedback was excellent and the group supported plans to increase the use of video examples, navigation aids, and the networking function.

#### SECD and Higher Education

- Rather than continuing to have conversational meetings, we are going to pilot the cross-fertilization of SECD among departments by talking to training leaders in colleges and universities:
- Our first pilot will begin with the College of St. Elizabeth on December 10. Joanne will host and will start with awareness piece to give people the "big picture" and let people know about the structure, research and practice. People will realize that the articulation of SECD within and across training programs is not a daunting or highly complex process. Joanne has added in competencies to Child and Adolescent Development and in school counseling (microskills)- and has found positive feedback.
- Jackie is exploring TCNJ as the next pilot site. We have also had some expression of interest from Rowan, Kean, and Rutgers and we encourage these and other institutions to actively follow up with us to begin pilots. At TCNJ, Jackie teaches a course on SECD (group dynamics); word has gotten around on campus because there is a lot of self-discovery and introspection; the director of admissions has asked all of her team to take the course. So there can be value added by increasing the visibility of SECD in higher education settings as well.

**ACTION STEP:** Janet and Michael Cohan will follow up with contacts at Kean and explore their interest in becoming a pilot. Jackie will pursue TCNJ's interest, following the first pilot meeting at CSE on December 10.

#### Introduction to the Alliance for SECD

- Phil Brown gave an overview of the Alliance, saying that it was a grass-roots organization. An ad hoc committee decided that such a group should be started and it resulted in a first annual conference last year.
- Phil introduced Alliance Co-Chair Georgiann Gongora and Sharon Biggs, Vice/Chair and Treasurer and Principal of Samuel R. Donald Elementary School in Bloomingdale, NJ. Each spoke to their commitment to building the "whole child". They shared their vision: helping to educate teachers and administrators in programs that work- providing examples, mentorship, giving teachers time for reflection, and in general getting educators and those concerned about education to not think of SECD as an add-on, but an essential part of what we do.
- [www.NJASECD.org](http://www.NJASECD.org) is up and almost running as a venue to sign up for the alliance. Information there can be found about a March 24, 2009- conference at Rutgers held for schools of character to present ideas to other school professionals.

#### **ADDITIONAL ACTION STEPS:**

In addition to any further feedback about the courses, ALL stakeholders, whether you attended or not, are asked to contact Maurice regarding opportunities in 2008-9 and 2009-10 to present at statewide or regional conference, contribute to your newsletters or web sites, and in other ways further our collaboration. PLEASE be sure also to follow up on the ACTION STEPS above before they leave your back burner. These matters are too important to all of us and to the children of NJ.
