Assessment Plan

As part of the Music 12 curriculum, learners will cover outcomes from three strands:

- Creating, Making, and Presenting
- Understanding and Connecting Contexts of Time, Place, and Community
- Perceiving and Responding

Learners will demonstrate growth across five categories, connected to curriculum outcomes:

- Knowing (20%) → music literacy and theory
- Doing (30%) → small group and solo performance skills, technical growth
- Connecting (20%) → composition, projects, and critical response to repertoire
- Collaborating (20%) → working effectively in group settings, including your co-curricular ensemble
- Personal Goal (10%) → independent project with reflections and final sharing session

Assessment includes conversations, observations, and projects with rubrics. Percentages may shift slightly as the course progresses.
