1. Welcome

We discussed what was shared in the Superintendent SCC meeting: Tanith shared that the superintendent discussed boundaries and how schools will happen with all the growth and what their plan, the challenge that is happening with the lower grade teachers due to COVID-19, and how far kids are behind due to COVID-19 and what has happened.

- b. Acadience Assessment: Reading assessment for phonics and phonemic awareness (handed acronyms for what each section of the assessment stands for) Test is given to all students K-5 this year. Looking at the data and that teachers are working to help students based on what they need, reviewed the data that we have with Acadience in Grades K-3 for 2018, 2019, 2021 Looking at the bottom quarter of our students we want to help them with whatever gaps they have
 - i. Tanith asked about reading and looking at support at home, wanting to do it so we mirror what teachers are doing. May be beneficial if teachers would be willing to share what they are doing to help students. Shamaayne mentioned that she would be willing to have a parent join the class during phonics/reading instruction time. Encouraged parents to reach out to teachers to help and assist with that and to see when would be a great time. Shamaayne discussed other ways to help by having conversations with our students to help with the language and language development.
- c. Acadience Assessment: Math assessment, is new this year in K-3. Teachers are participating in CMI instruction for math

- d. RISE Results for Math testing: there are areas we want to improve on and there are areas where things are going great
