Six Essay Topics:

- 1. How is *The Artist* both an example of modern filmmaking, and a tribute to films from the silent era?
- 2. How does *The Artist* use sound and cinematography (black and white, as well as shots, transitions, etc.) to create a compelling story?
- 3. The Artist imitates the style of the early silent cinema in order to tell a story about silent cinema. What is that story, and why is it important?
- 4. How is The Artist a love story?
- 5. How do the characters help develop the theme of The Artist?
- 6. How is *The Artist* an example of parody (or a *pastiche*) of silent film at the same time as a tribute to silent film?
