There will be one (1) point awarded for each dollar (\$) won at MRCA First approved rodeos in each of the nine (9) standard events. (This includes prize money, entry fees and day money)

A. The Rough Stock event contestants will receive 1 point for every MRCA 1st sanctioned event they compete in, only to qualify them for the finals.

Change to:

There will be one (1) point awarded for each dollar (\$) won at MRCA First approved rodeos in each of the nine (9) standard events. (This includes prize money, entry fees and day money)
Day money counts toward the standings at MRCA First Rodeos only.

(Delete Rule 2A)

Rule to go into effect in the 2026 Season

A minimum of four hundred (\$400) dollars must be added in each standard event except at winter rodeos, from November 1 to May 1, a minimum of one hundred fifty (\$150) dollars must be added.

Proposed Rule:

A minimum of four hundred (\$400) dollars must be added at all new rodeos in each standard event except at winter rodeos, from November 1 to May 1, a minimum of one hundred fifty (\$150) dollars must be added.

Page 17 - OFFICIAL RODEO RULES

1. Entry fees at all MRCA rodeos shall be \$50 for all events, except the Barrel Racing. In the Barrel Racing the entry fee shall be \$60. It is the contractor's decision to allow rough stock events (bb, sb, br) to enter twice in these events no matter the amount of added money.

Change: In the Breakaway Roping and the Tie Down Roping the entry fee shall be \$70.

For Finals Personnel the top 20 contestants for each event will vote accordingly:

Judges: timed event contestants (excluding barrel racers) will vote for a flag judge only, rough stock contestants will vote for rough stock judge and the board of directors will vote for third judge. Both Roughstock judges will work the line if they are different from the voted flag judge.

In any timed event if the animal fails to break the neck rope before the score line or fails to stand up in the chute 3 times a re-run will be given on a different animal and the first animal will be pulled from the herd. All contestants having that animal will be moved to the end of the draw.

Change to:

At judges' or stock contractors' discretion a sullen or uncooperative animal may be pulled from the herd. In such instance the extra will be used and will endeavor to be run in that performance or run of slack. Contestant has ultimate option to take animal as is or take extra.

That the MRCA shall pay the stock contractor who sanctions the most MRCA first rodeos in a year will be awarded \$1000 , the stock contractor who sanctions the second most MRCA first rodeos will be awarded \$750 and the stock contractor with the third most MRCA rodeos will be awarded \$250.

Pg 23 K

Current Rule:

At least 1 judge must be from MRCA if it is MRCA first approved.

Proposed Rule:

All judges must be from MRCA if it is MRCA first approved.

AND

Add M:

Judges will be split into 3 categories:

- A. 5years of experience judging or more and approved by the board of directors.
- B. 3 years of experience without a fineable offense in MRCA or any co-approving associations.
- C. Less than 3 years of experience and/or a fineable offense in the last 2 rodeo seasons.

Pay for A and B Judges will be \$2 per entry and the pay for C Judges will be \$1.50. \$2 will be collected per entry. The extra \$0.50 (cents) will go to judges voted to judge finals.

AND:

Currently H Reads: All Judges must attend an approved MRCA Judging Clinic their first four (4) years being an MRCA approved judge. After judging for four (4) years the requirement will be to attend an MRCA Judging Clinic every other year.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT:

All judges must attend a full day clinic. A judges will be required to attend an MRCA approved judging clinic every 3 years. B and C judges will be required to attend and MRCA approved judging clinic annually..

The MRCA will approve stand alone events from November 1 until April 1. Monies won would accrue toward individual event standings but will not be counted in the all-around

Standings. Competing in stand alone events will not count toward total rodeo count to qualify for the MRCA finals. All stand alone events must be submitted for approval 30 days in advance to association and will not be scheduled in conflict with an existing rodeo.

Stand alone events can be sanctioned as Open/MRCA.

Instead of a percentage of prize money being paid to the MRCA, a \$10 fee per entry, regardless if the contestant is an MRCA member or not, will be assessed and sent in to the MRCA secretary along with the results no later than 7 days after the completion of said event.

All stand alone events shall have a minimum of \$750 added per event. This rule will expire in 1 year and will require a vote by the membership to renew. Contestants entering multiple times can only designate 1 entry to count before competing with the event Secretary.

Page 35 Line 6

Riders who are fouled at chute or if animal falls completely down, may be entitled to a reride at judges discretion.

Proposal: Riders who are fouled at the chute or if an animal fouls itself and causes a buck off, contestant will be awarded a re-ride. If the animals' hock(s) or knees touch the ground it is considered a foul.
