Mission: To provide SSV events information and relevant updates to the in-person and online audiences on

Sunday mornings.

Announcements Team Member

Time: Approximately 1.5 hours on Sunday mornings and 30 minutes - 1 hour of preparation in the days leading up to Sunday.

Description: An audition is required and training will take place over a few weeks/months depending on the need. As an announcements team member, you are responsible to share announcements in a balanced way be professional, yet have a casual/informal presence. We want you to be comfortable on stage, in front of people, and be able to give the announcements with energy and attention to details.

Specifics

- Practice announcements for approximately 30 minutes 1 hour in the days leading up to giving announcements, to become familiar with details and comfortable with delivery.
- Arrive by 10:10am on Sunday mornings and check in with the administrative assistant to go over important reminders when needed.
- Clearly and succinctly deliver announcements with confident humility and positivity.
- Receive constructive feedback from administrative assistant and Pastors (if applicable) with humility and be willing to improve based on said feedback.

Mission: To provide outstanding cleanliness, service and set up for God's house.

Facilities Team Member

Time: Various times throughout the week and including Sunday mornings.

Description: As a facilities team member, you will make an impact on making the physical space of the SSV a welcoming place for our members and guests. This is accomplished by reducing any barriers to feeling comfortable in our space. This is done by cleaning and organizing spaces as well as setting up and tearing down for events and programs.

- Cleaning
- Organizing
- Setting up and tearing down for programs and events

First Impressions Ministry

Mission: To warmly welcome guests, regular attenders, and members into our SSV house and community.

First Impression Team Member

Time: Various time commitments during the Sunday morning service.

Description: As a team member in the hospitality ministry, you have the opportunity to help create an environment where our guests and members feel welcome, comfortable and are all able to build meaningful relationships. The spiritual gift of hospitality is not required but a friendly disposition and desire to help people feel comfortable and connected is a must.

Specifics

- Arrive 30 minutes before Sunday morning service and 20 minutes before any special service (i.e. Night of Worship) begins.
- Greet, smile and welcome individuals entering the building.
- Ensure the Information Table is neat and organized.
- Manage "RESERVED" back two rows for those with a cane, walker or wheelchair, etc.
- Usher guests to available seats.
- Remain at both entry/exit doors 10-15 minutes after service to answer and thank everyone for coming.

Hospitality Ministry

Mission: To create an environment where guests and members are welcomed into the physical environment, making it easy and comfortable to enjoy the company of others.

Hospitality Team Member

Time: Various time commitments during the Sunday morning service.

Description: As a team member in the hospitality ministry, you have the opportunity to help create an environment where our guests and members feel welcome, comfortable and are all able to build meaningful relationships. The spiritual gift of hospitality is not required but a friendly disposition and desire to help people feel comfortable and connected is a must.

Specifics

- Set up beverage and snack tables before service.
- Clean up beverage and snack tables and wash dishes after service.
- Prepare and set up any necessary stage decor.
- Be sure auditorium supplies are stocked (Bibles, seat backs).
- Prepare Communion supplies (once a month).
- Communicate to the hospitality leader any new ideas or concerns.

Kids Ministry

Mission: Partnering with families to actively extend the Kingdom of God through ministry and love so that children who don't know Jesus will come to know Him and those who know Him will know Him more.

Classroom Teacher

Time: Two Sunday services per month

Description: As a classroom teacher, you are responsible for co-teaching the lessons to the children in kids church, with another classroom teacher. The children range in age from infants through 5th grade. Each week, you will get a lesson plan from the coordinator and supplies are provided in the classroom.

Qualifications for serving:

- Adult volunteers must have been attending the SSV for at least 6 months, in good standing
- Must be at least 18 years old
- (Volunteers under age 18 must be participating in the SSV Student Ministry and will serve as helpers with adults.)
- Criminal background check will be completed and updated yearly
- Child Safety Training will be completed and updated yearly
- An "SSV Kids Ministry Volunteer Handbook Acknowledgement and Agreement" must be signed

Specifics:

- On the week you are assigned to teach, you will be contacted by the Kids Ministry Administrative Assistant via email about the upcoming lesson
- Review the lesson before Sunday
- On Sunday, check in with the coordinator or administrative assistant 30 minutes before the service starts to help set up your classroom and welcome children
- Teach the lesson with enthusiasm
- Help clean up and check out children as needed
- Pray for the Kids Ministry

Parking Lot Ministry

Mission: To provide direction and parking control measures, be a warm initial community impression, and maintain a proactive security presence outside of the church building.

Parking Lot Team Member

Time: 1 hour (10:10am to 11am)

Description: Parking Lot Team Members are critical personnel who will be responsible for overseeing and monitoring the traffic flow of vehicles entering and parking in the church parking lot. Making the first and sometimes long-lasting impression to everyone coming to worship, whether first-time visitors or regular attendees. Team members will also serve by having a ready posture to proactively monitor activity outside of the building from a safety and security point of view.

- Partner with the Security and Facilities Teams to ensure the parking lot areas are clear, safe, and secure.
- Arrive early before service with a desire to show God's kindness in your interactions with the people you encounter.

- Remain aware and attentive to people who might need assistance in the parking lot areas.
- Wear a radio that is monitored by key church personnel and staff for timely and effective communications across multiple teams.
- Assist people coming in and out of the building during inclement weather or other adverse conditions
- Be willing to communicate and take directions/instructions from the ministry head, as the team continually grows and improves.
- Be consistent with your commitment to the ministry and team as we build a strong, effective, and very important team for our community.

Prayer Ministry

Mission: To actively engage in the process of praying for and with individuals so that we continue to see the Kingdom of God come more and more fully on this Earth. At the Vineyard, we train prayer team members to pray using a specific prayer model. Our church desires to be a House of Prayer. To that end, we encourage actively praying even beyond the specifics of what we call "ministry time" at the end of each service. This includes an active prayer life throughout the week, during small groups, and at special services.

Prayer Team Member

Time: At the end of each service. Online (Zoom) and in-person options available.

Description: As a team member on the prayer team, you will be trained to pray with confidentiality and sensitivity for people as they ask for prayer.

Specifics

- Train to become a prayer team member by taking our Kingdom Prayer class.
- Commit to actively praying for people in small group.
- Partner with a veteran prayer team member to train in the Vineyard prayer model.
- Pray for people using the Vineyard prayer model.
- Communicate with the Prayer Ministry Coordinator if you have any questions or concerns.

Safe Families for Children

Mission: Safe Families for Children hosts vulnerable children and creates extended family–like support for families facing a crisis through a community of devoted volunteers who are motivated by compassion to keep children safe and families intact.

Host Family

Time: As needed

Description: Host Families voluntarily host children in their home for short periods of time. They are screened and approved by Safe Families for Children staff. If you are looking for a truly rewarding and challenging experience, consider becoming a Safe Families Host Family. You will make a lasting impression on a child in need and possibly change the trajectory of a family in crisis. Host Families serve as the backbone of the Safe

Families movement. Without families opening their homes and opening their hearts, we could not care for vulnerable children in our communities.

Specifics:

- Must be at least 25 years of age
- Must be emotionally and financially stable, mature, law-abiding, healthy and active
- Must be willing to engage in a long-term friendship with a family in need
- Must agree to not use drugs, and refrain from using profanity or engaging in other negative behavior that may impact the child
- To become a host family, you will fill out an application, expect a home visit and background check, complete required training, and submit three references

Family Friend

Time: As needed

Description: Family Friends volunteer to provide support to families in crisis (e.g., mentoring, transportation) and respite to Host Families (e.g., providing meals, babysitting). When you volunteer as a Family Friend, Safe Families for Children will connect you with an at-risk family that would benefit from a healthy support system. Family Friends encourage and strengthen families in crisis so that they may thrive. Performing small tasks, such as dropping off diapers or babysitting for a few hours, provides families with support and builds relationships.

Specifics:

- Complete required training; if providing respite (babysitting) to host families, will expect a home visit and background check
- Provide friendship and encouragement
- Share helpful information about parenting and life
- Support parents who have children staying with Host Families
 Advocate for families seeking resources for their children, such as schools or mental and physical health services

Resource Friend

Time: As needed

Description: Resource Friends volunteer to provide tangible support through material goods. The SSV has started a Safe Families Resource Closet where many of these material goods are stored, to be used when needed by Host Families while hosting a child through Safe Families, or by placing families who have placed their child with a Host Family.

Specifics:

- Provide resources to the SSV Resource Closet when needed
- Become a part of our SSV Resource Friend network, to be contacted, when a need arises
- May also help with sorting and organizing material goods in our SSV Resource Closet

May attend Safe Families training (optional)

Snow Shoveling Ministry

Mission: To be a blessing to senior citizens in the Homewood-Flossmoor area by shoveling snow from their personal porches, sidewalks, and/or driveways.

Snow Shoveling Team Member

Time: Varies upon snowfalls

Description: As a snow shoveling team member, you will make an impact by providing a physical service to people in need. This is incredibly important because many of these people may be lonely, shut in their homes, and may not regularly receive [free] help. We can literally be the hands and feet of Jesus through this ministry! **Specifics**

- Be willing to help out whenever possible. When it snows and the SSV receives calls for snow shoveling needs, we contact all team members to see who is available.
- Be physically able to shovel snow with a shovel or snow blower. It works best if you own a functional shovel or snowblower. (The SSV has a few shovels if you need to borrow one.)
- Team up with other team members whenever possible. Work smarter, not harder!

Small Groups Ministry

 Mission: To facilitate spiritual, personal and relational growth through meeting in a smaller, more intimate setting.

Small Group Leader

Time: Approximately 2.5 hours per week

Description: As a small group leader, you will provide an environment to facilitate conversation, prayer, worship and relational growth. This can be centered around a recap of Sunday's message, a particular book, an activity or another means of promoting relationships and growth. Groups can meet via Zoom or in person.

- Commit to regular attendance on Sundays and other church activities.
- Pray for your group/attendees regularly.
- Communicate weekly with attendees via email/text regarding weekly meetings.
- Be willing to reach out to congregants in conversation and invite them to group.
- Be prepared to do life with attendees in both the good and bad times.
- Send a report to Small Group Coordinator weekly regarding group.
- Be willing to intern with an experienced leader before potentially leading your own group.
- Communicate with Coordinator in event of issues that may arise or need for additional resources/assistance.

Student Ministry

Mission: To develop a healthy, safe environment where students can encounter Jesus and grow to know and love Him. A place where students can discover their God-given gifts, talents and strengths and practice using, developing and growing in those gifts.

Student Ministry Teacher

Time: Approximately 2.5 hours on Sundays

Description: As a team member in the student ministry, you will have the opportunity to engage in a dialogue with our students (6th - 12th grade), introducing them to Jesus and the ways their gifts intersect with the world around them. In Student Ministry, we are focused on igniting passion for Jesus by developing what God has already put inside of them.

Specifics

- Prior to Sunday morning, review the lesson and prepare for teaching.
- Arrive 30 minutes before service and check in with the other volunteers to see where help is needed.
- Participate, lead, and guide both large group and small group discussions.
- Pray for the Student Ministry.
- Hang out with awesome students.

Tech Ministry

Mission: To support, complement, and enhance the gathering experience by creating a pleasing audio environment and visual presentation.

Tech Team Member

Description: As a tech team member, there are four different roles to serve in.

Sound Technician

Time: 7 hours (Thursday 6:30pm – 9pm (Rehearsal) | Sunday 8am – 12:30pm)

Specifics

- Team up with other team members to prep stage and set up equipment.
- Running audio cables and placing/moving instruments on stage as needed.
- Designing (mixing) the sound for both in-house and the livestream congregation.
- Oversee all other functions of the Tech Team to ensure cohesion between all roles.

Projection

Time: 3 ½ hours (Sunday 8:30am - Noon)

- Review/proofread presentations via Keynote and/or PowerPoint.
- Display presentations via ProPresenter with assistance via order of service and sermon outline.

Display worship lyrics via ProPresenter (song knowledge required; setlist provided prior to Sundays).

Camera Person

Time: 2 hours (Sunday 10am – Noon)

Specifics

- Ability to stand for long periods of time.
- Prepare camera scenes/shots.
- Ability to capture presenter (both still and in motion).
- Work in coordination with the Technical Director on all aspects of shots (timing, angle, etc.).
- Responsible for adjustments in stage lighting.

Video Technical Director

Time: 2 hours (Sunday 10am - Noon)

Specifics

- Responsible for selecting active scenes to show to the YouTube Live audience.
- Work in coordination with Camera Person and Projection to ensure smooth transition points.
- Assist in stage lighting adjustments.

Women's Ministry

Mission: To draw women into a deeper relationship with God, while building rich relationships with other women in the community. Our goal is to provide prayerfully planned events, fellowship opportunities, and workshops that encourage women to seek Jesus and lean into community.

Women's Ministry Team Member

Time: Various time commitments throughout the year

Description: As a team member in the women's ministry, you have the opportunity to help with the planning, preparing, praying, and executing of women's ministry events. You will not be required to volunteer or assist in planning every event, but we ask that you serve the events that best suit your interests and/or gifts. We also welcome your ideas and suggestions for how we can better serve the women in our community.

Specifics

- Attend a yearly brainstorming meeting to prepare for events for the year.
- Assist in planning and preparing for specific events throughout the year as the event approaches.
- Be willing to lead or assist in leading an event.
- Prepare and set up any necessary event décor/supplies.
- Be prayerful for the women attending, as each event approaches.

Worship Ministry

Mission: To connect the hearts of the congregation to the heart of God through musical worship. To create an atmosphere where people can connect with God through music.

Worship Team Member

Time: Play or sing at least twice per month. Two-hour rehearsals are scheduled one evening during the week prior to the day you are scheduled. Sunday morning sound check is typically at 8:30am.

Description: As a worship team member, you will have the opportunity to contribute to the musical portion of the worship experience at the SSV.

- Engage in personal worship and develop a lifestyle of worship.
- Play your instrument and/or sing well and be able to contribute to the musicality of the band.
- Attend rehearsals and be prepared, having music ready and instruments tuned.
- Commit to continue improving your skills as a singer/musician.
- Listen to and follow the worship leader's and music director's leadership during rehearsal and services.
- Practice songs during the week and be familiar with songs to effectively play and sing during rehearsals and services.
- Communicate to the worship leader, coordinator and music director any questions, suggestions or concerns.
