- **Be an effective ally–** Don't let this be a "trend", we must *actively* be anti-racist. Acknowledge your implicit biases (everyone has them) and fight against them.

SUPPORT PROTESTORS:

- Turn off location services and don't be alone when protesting
- Bring and donate first aid supplies
- Wear clothing that covers any identifiable markings (i.e. tattoos, birthmarks)
 - Face masks are key during the pandemic and against facial recognition
- Be aware of who organized the protest, as many radical left and right wing protestors are using them as an excuse for violence
- Look out for undercover police officers: they may wear armbands/wristbands, protective gear, heavy footwear
