Deacon's Corner

#### Saint Maximilian Kolbe

Few saints embody the Knights of Columbus principles of charity, unity, and patriotism more than Saint Maximilian Kolbe, whose feast we celebrate on August 14. A Polish Franciscan priest, Kolbe lived during one of the darkest periods of the 20th century—and chose light over darkness, love over hatred, and sacrifice over self-preservation.

Born in 1894, Maximilian had a deep devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary from a young age. He founded the Militia Immaculatae ("Army of the Immaculate One") to bring souls to Christ through Mary, using modern media—printing presses and radio—to spread the faith across Europe and Japan.

Kolbe's greatest witness occurred at Auschwitz. In July 1941, after a prisoner escaped, ten others were condemned to death. Hearing one was a husband and father, Kolbe stepped forward, declaring, "I am a Catholic priest. Let me take his place." He was executed by lethal injection on August 14, 1941.

The man Kolbe saved, Franciszek Gajowniczek, survived and attended Kolbe's canonization in 1982, where Pope John Paul II named Kolbe a "martyr of charity." Today, Kolbe is the patron saint of journalists, prisoners, and the pro-life movement. For Knights, St. Maximilian Kolbe remains a powerful model of Christ-like love.

Here is a reflection I found to St. Maximilian Kolbe:

St. Maximilian Kolbe, martyr of charity, you gave your life in heroic love. You faced hatred with mercy, darkness with light, and cruelty with courage.

Intercede for us, that we may love sacrificially, stand firm in truth, and serve joyfully.

Teach us to see Christ in suffering, offer hope where there is despair, and remain faithful in trials.

Patron of the oppressed, pray for our families, our Church, and world. Inspire Knights of Columbus to follow your example— to be men of charity, unity, and fearless love.

We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

St. Maximilian Kolbe, pray for us.
