The Engagement Team at Oxford Net Zero is looking for three new research assistants to start in February 2023 to support our growing work programme on civil society engagement, net zero policy, and communications. We are looking for energetic, self-motivated and applied professionals who want to help us bridge the gap between the latest academic insights on net zero and best practice.

Timeline:
