#### **ADVANCE ASSIGNMENTS FOR INTENSIVE COURSES AND OBSERVANCE OF RELIGIOUS HOLIDAYS**

A class syllabus including any advance reading and/or writing assignments for intensive classes will be posted to Courses 3-4 weeks prior to the start of class. Please note that it is each student's responsibility to review the syllabus well before the class begins and complete any advance assignments. Students who show up the first day unprepared risk being dropped from the class.

If a student intends to miss one or more classes for religious observance in an intensive course (i.e., one that runs for a shorter period than a regular semester term), he or she must notify the Academic Dean prior to registering for that intensive course to determine whether such absences would fundamentally alter the nature of the intensive course.

#### **EXTERNSHIP ENROLLMENT**

Students cannot register for externships through WaveNet. All students are required to have their externship placement confirmed with the Straus office before they can register. #### **NEW FACULTY**

##### **CORRIE NAPIER**

He is an Adjunct Professor at the Straus Institute and is also an Adjunct Professor at Regent Law. He holds a J.D. and M.D.R. from Pepperdine Law, as well as a bachelor's in Philosophy and Religion from the College of William and Mary.

#### **NEW CLASS**

LAW 2282.01 "Building Mixed-Mode Systems - Neg/Arb/Med -

In Trade and Supply Chain Networks. A hands-on mixed-mode approach towards conflict governance/resolution in domestic and international trade networks. This class gives students the opportunity of dealing with the dispute resolution needs of domestic and international supply chain parties and stakeholders, in regards to (i) adequate methods, (ii) system design specificities, and (iii) essential agreements. It also familiarizes the students with a whole set of legal documents commonly used by attorneys and neutrals in the management and resolution of trade conflicts, through drafting exercises

and simulations. Its ultimate goal is to prepare attendants to respond to the contemporary dispute resolution demands of supply networks and to train them on how to apply hybrid modes - namely negotiation/arbitration/mediation - to real life situations."

Join Pepperdine School of Law Professor **Maureen Weston**, author of Sports Law: Cases and Materials; and adjunct professor Jeffrey G. Benz, renowned arbitrator with JAMS, the Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS), and former General Counsel for the U.S. Olympic Committee (USOC), along with distinguished speakers and experts for an intensive one week study of lectures, experiential learning, and on-site visits covering US Olympic and European sports, arbitration/mediation, anti-doping, and eligibility issues, as well as media and crisis management in the face of disputes in sport. Among others, we will hear from or visit with various UK, European and Olympic sport lawyers, officials, and agencies, as well as learn how sports arbitration works at the Olympic Games and in US and international sports. Experience and learn about international sports law, dispute resolution, and the business, legal, and policy issues involving the Olympic Games in one of the world's great cities where Pepperdine has a fabulous building near Hyde Park in London!
