The Psalms divided into five books were written by various authors over the span of hundreds of years. David wrote roughly half of them as a means of worship - some songs of praise and others as prayers of lament. Some of the most well-known verses in all of Scripture come from the Psalms and many are prophetic as seen later in the New Testament. What stands out the most is its authors' passion and honesty - leading us by example in approaching the throne of God from the deep recess of the heart.
