### Important Reminders:

- All administrations of EOC and CTE assessments must be in person as required by state policy. Students may not take these exams from home.
- Students must bring their **fully charged WCPSS Chromebook** to campus for every EOC/CTE test. EOC/CTE exams cannot be taken on family owned devices. Middle Creek High School does not have the technology to support testing for students who do not bring devices.
- Bag lunches will be available on testing days.
- Students can leave campus at 12:00 with a signed [MCHS exam release form](#) from their parents. **Students may not check out of school during an exam period.** Students remaining on campus will be assigned to a Study Hall.
- Testing will begin as close to 7:25 as possible. Students arriving late will not be permitted to enter test settings and will have to attend on the make-up day.
- If absent from an EOC or CTE exam, the makeup exam will be on **January 17th at 7:25**. Teachers in EOC/CTE courses will contact parents of students who miss exams. Students who do not have an exam to make up will not attend school on January 17th. All teacher made (non-state) make-up exams must be scheduled with teachers.
- According to North Carolina testing policy, students are not permitted to bring electronic devices (other than approved calculators) into the testing room at any time during state testing, including breaks. Any student with a cell phone/electronic device during testing must be dismissed from testing, and a misadministration will be declared for the student. **EOC teachers will be collecting electronic devices in EOC testing rooms to prevent any testing mis-administrations.**
- For the 2024-2025 School Year, students in grade 12 (seniors) can be exempt from non-state final exams based on the following criteria: Students must have a projected final grade of B or higher. Students must have 10 or fewer absences in the course. Students cannot be exempt from state testing including field testing.
