- To grade and return work to students within a reasonable period of time;

- To encourage students and parents to communicate with me about questions or concerns.

Parent Responsibilities

- To encourage and support my child in attending school regularly;
- To inform a teacher if my child has problems with learning or is struggling with assignments;
- To track my child's academic record using the school's provided grade book;
- To support my child's learning at home;
- To encourage my child to do their best on assessments;
- To volunteer at the school, when appropriate;
- To participate in school activities, programs, and events when possible;
- To participate in decisions about my child's education.

Student Responsibilities

- To let a teacher and family member know if I need help;
- To keep track of assignment deadlines and test dates;
- To follow school rules as explained in school policies, the student handbook, and instructions from teachers;
- To complete work in class and homework as assigned;
- To commit to attend school regularly;
- To commit to working toward academic success;
- To take responsibility for my own actions related to my academic success.
