OSHKOSH SAILOR DIES OF INJURIES

Information has been received here of the death of F 1 Larry Wilson, 18, son of Mrs. William Tesch, Oakwood Beach, who passed away at a hospital at Long Beach, Calif., early Monday morning as the result of injuries sustained in an automobile accident Sunday night. No further information in regard to the accident was available.

Wilson was attending Oshkosh High school at the time of his enlistment in the navy in June, 1944. He took his boot training at the Great Lakes, Ill., naval training center and had further training at Urbana, Ill., Little Creek, Va., and in Texas.

Larry W. Wilson, 17, Route 5, Oshkosh, was recently enrolled in a course at the amphibious fireman naval training school at the University of Illinois.
