



#### 1. SEGMENT

- It's that time yet again as "Exit Mask" by The Hyena Kill plays and it's time for Volume 74 to begin! The fans in The Stark Ballroom are beyond excited and REBELLION promoter **Richard Olayinka** doesn't keep them waiting too long as

he makes his way to the ring. He welcomes everyone to the show and mentions an interesting twist to tonight's main event. Some fans may have already noticed, but tonight, Holly Chainsaw and Kaelan Laughlin will be competing for a newly designed European Championship! The belt with the red strap has been retired and Holly will bring in the new belt in the main event. How exciting!

- After that, there's not much else to go through and after Olayinka runs down the night's card, he puts some emphasis on the European Championship main event once more, and gets the show started!
2. 3 Ring Barney (Luna Baby [O] & Royston Popplewell) and Chelsea Li defeated Two And A Half Fuzz (Barry John Reynolds [X] & Neal Durden) and Wulf Erikssen with a Big Top (450 SSP) (12:19).
- Coming into this match, **3 Ring Barney** has been on a bit of a slump and only making matters worse is the light cast that Chester Roosevelt has to wear as he watches his team from ringside. As for **Two And A Half Fuzz**, they've impressive since they stepped first foot inside a REBELLION ring and with former Manchester Champion **Wulf Erikssen** by their side, they've got to like their odds. Though the unpredictability of the Ballroom Champion **Chelsea Li** definitely fits in with the rest of the oddballs.
  - A lot of personalities to mesh with in this match as they're all showcased at various points throughout the match. Wulf's bruiser brawler style went up against Royston's catch wrestling, Luna's lucha-inspired offense against Neal's technical high flying, and Chelsea's striking background against Barry's British strong style. We get a lot of obvious cohesion between the established teams, but we were treated with the occasional trio maneuver from both sides as well.
  - As the chaos ensues, we get to a point where nearly everyone is fighting on the outside save for the legal participants. The referee is trying to restore order on the outside as he barks at everyone, but back in the ring, Barry got Luna up top for his Rule of the Admin only for Chester Roosevelt to leap up on the apron and blast Reynolds with that cast! Baby shakes off the cobwebs before flying off with her Big Top to pull off the upset over our heroes!
3. **SEGMENT**
- As the aftermath of the match settles, the camera goes backstage for the first time tonight and we've got some chaos! There's a brawl going on as the camera focuses on REBELLION rookie **Marion Hanson** trying to fight back against **Coda**! It seems like the former Ballroom Championship has picked herself another victim and Hanson's size helps him for a good bit, but once Coda got him with her Rhapsody (reverse STO into arm triangle choke), things were over. An official called for the "match" and that was another win for Coda.
  - She then looked into the camera and said she wanted better competition. At Volume 75, she will be waiting for a challenger. And if no one presents themselves, then Coda will go out and pick her opponent. The camera stays with Coda for just a moment longer before fading back to ringside.

4. El Hijo del Señor Ass defeated Will Olayinka with his Rectum Damn Near Killed Em (Diving Reverse Cannonball Senton) (9:52).
  - One for the fans as **El Hijo del Señor Ass** came to entertain (and continue his betting operation of questionable legality) and **Will Olayinka** was looking to do the same, but Olayinka came into this one looking to actually win as to where Señor Ass was just happy to be here.
  - There's some fast paced action right out of the gate that carried on through the majority of the match. El Hijo del Señor Ass looked pretty good, but he was a bit too focused on entertaining the crowd and it'd distract him several times throughout the match. At one point we see Will hit a beautiful springboard 450 splash, but Señor Ass got a shoulder up before the three. The crowd somehow got divided between the two wrestlers and even more so when Señor Ass hit his Logsplitter (Boosted Atomic Drop) on Olayinka for some laughs.
  - But the laughs come to an end once Will dropped Señor Ass with a superkick and attempted his Man City Splash, but the masked luchador rolled out of the way at the last second. With Olayinka on the canvas, Señor Ass decided to pull out a trick of his own by heading up, and coming right off the top rope with his aptly named Rectum Damn Near Killed Em as he wraps up a victory for himself.
5. Will Neilson defeated Anna Daniels and Mimi Smith with his Deep Fried Knee (Wristlock Bicycle Knee) (13:26).
  - A couple of different stories heading into this one. **Mimi Smith** has been in the quest for the Ballroom Championship for some time and so is **Will Neilson** as the two went through the tournament for the then-vacant belt. However, Neilson's got his eyes elsewhere for the moment after the wife of Jacky Rex Daniels, **Anna Daniels**, cost him a match against the former REBELLION World Champion last week. Now he's looking for some revenge while Anna looks to pick up another win and Mimi will do her best to take advantage of the situation.
  - Mimi played it smart and waited things out while Will took out his aggressions on Anna, but the so-called Muse wasn't one to back down from a proper fight. And when the time presented itself, Mimi struck in an attempt to get herself ahead in the match. We saw several close calls throughout the match including Smith dropping Daniels with a Shiny Teeth No More (Jumping Roundhouse Kick) with a pin that was broken up by Neilson. He'd get Mimi with his Last Surprise (Leaping Flatliner) next, but again, the pin was broken up, this time by Anna. And she'd hit Will with her Sombras Que Corta (Neckbreaker Cutter) for a dangerously close two count.
  - In the closing moments, Mimi once again waited for her moment to strike and it came in the form of a Rock-A-Bye-Baddie ( Sleeper Hold) on Will after he dispatched Anna. It looked like Neilson was ready to tap when Daniels broke the hold and immediately pulled Smith into her Oncoming Storm (Double Underhook Brainbuster)! She tried for the pin only for Neilson to recover at the last second as he grabbed Daniels by her wrist for the Deep Fried Knee! The pin followed and this time no one broke it up after Will scored a big win over Anna and Mimi.

## 6. SEGMENT

- Picking up a big win, the camera catches up with **Will Neilson** in the back. He says that at Volume 73, he should've beaten Jacky Rex Daniels, but Anna had to get in the way. And now that she's taken care of, he wants another shot at the former REBELLION World Champion. And Neilson wants that match at Volume 75. He knows that Jacky's got nothing better to do at the next show, so now's the time to put up or shut up. As Neilson walks off, we watch some replays from the match before going back to the ring for our upcoming Manchester Championship match.

## 7. **Manchester Championship Match:** Osmond Bradley © defeated Skull Kid 1 with his Undeniable (Fireman's Carry into Sitout Scoop Slam Piledriver) (12:30).

*V3 for Osmond Bradley*

- With the new incentive to defend the Manchester Championship, we've seen **Osmond Bradley** on his A-game as of late and after defeating Skull Kid 2 last week, he looked to repeat it against the stockier **Skull Kid 1** in his quest to retain his belt for a third time.
- Last week Bradley had to deal with the lethal speed of Skull Kid 2 with his thunderous punches and kicks, but this week was another test as Skull Kid 1's strength and surprisingly vast knowledge of suplexes gave the champ some great difficulty. The crowd bit hard for a couple of near falls by Skull Kid 1 as he caught Osmond with a bridging German suplex at one point and then another close call after a superplex to the center of the ring. But Bradley was determined to not look like a joke against the Skull Kids and showed his technical ability against SK1, wearing him down with quick holds.
- Once Osmond used his technical arsenal against Skull Kid 1, the match was pretty much decided and it wasn't much longer before Bradley dropped SK1 with his Undeniable for the three count. A hard fought effort by SK1, but now he can turn his attention (presumably) to the PEAK Tag Team Championships with his brother.

## 8. SEGMENT

- Somewhere in the back, we come across **El Hijo del Señor Ass** and a group of unspecified individuals. Some are cheering and others have their hands in their heads as Señor Ass collects a huge pile of money to then start dishing out to those cheering. He reminds everyone that you can't win every night and that perhaps betting on the Skull Kids individually wasn't the greatest of ideas. However, one bettor informs Señor Ass that he doesn't have all the money to pay back after the failed bet. El Hijo del Señor Ass says that's not a problem, he can just go double or nothing at Volume 75 and earn his winnings back!
  - It doesn't sound like the greatest of ideas, but a newly developed gambling addiction is a real bitch and the bettor accepts the offer from El Hijo del Señor ass as the camera goes back ringside.
9. Katya Djurdjevic defeated Rosaline Davies with her Thundering Skies (Imploding 450 Splash) (14:01).

- While these two haven't had a proper chance to cross paths before in REBELLION, there's an interesting dynamic here. **Rosaline Davies** came into REBELLION as one of the hottest prospects and acted on that potential by becoming the European Champion. Now two years later, it's **Katya Djurdjevic** who is the new kid on the block with a lot of eyes on her. A win here for either competitor would do wonders for them moving forward.
- A lot of respect shown in this match, but it was obvious from the start that Rosaline was determined to win this one. And she very nearly did with her Red Dragon Suplex (Bridging Dragon Suplex) and then a Nos Da (Knee Trembler) after Katya kicked out. But the Russian prospect was just too relisant to be put down and Djurdjevic's Dreadbringer (German Suplex), bringing Davies into the ring, and with a pin after it almost ended things early.
- The match came down to whoever could hit the next big move next and in a stunning sequence of events, that person ended up being Katya as she avoided a Shining Wizard and caught Rosaline with a single leg dropkick that kept the former European Champion down long enough for Djurdjevic's Thundering Skies for another big victory! You could call it an upset, but at some point, that stops being the case.
- After the match, Katya offers a hand to her opponent and while Rosaline's obviously disappointed in the result of the match, she shakes Djurdjevic's hand with the crowd's approval.

## 10. SEGMENT

- In the back, **Will Olayinka** is looking a bit dejected over his loss earlier in the night. Especially against El Hijo del Señor Ass. And it looks like Will's night is only going to get worse as **3 Ring Barney** enter the scene. Olayinka's ready to fight, but Chester informs Richard's nephew that he won't be needing to do any of that. Sure, Luna may want to rip Will's eyes out after he eliminated her in the REBELLION Rumble, but Chester's a gentleman and making sure that isn't happening right now.
- Instead, Chester's got an offer for the young William. Chester just received the great news that he's been cleared to compete after this week and that means he'll need a match for Volume 75. Will says there's no chance he takes it with Chester still wearing a cast, but the ringleader of 3 Ring Barney informs Olayinka that shouldn't be an issue. Sure, he'll still have to wear it for a few more weeks, but he's been told that if he uses it, he'll be disqualified. So, basically, Roosevelt will be fighting with one arm for the foreseeable future.
- Olayinka still isn't sold on the idea, but Roosevelt reminds Will how important a victory against someone of Chester's caliber would be. After all, he's a former REBELLION Champion and 3 Ring Barney, whether you like them or not, have been a force in REBELLION. And given tonight's result, Will could use a win. It won't come easy and it may not come at all, but what's the worst that could happen?

- The obvious answer is a lot of things, but it's an offer that is just too good for Will to pass up. He thinks about it for a second before agreeing to Chester's challenge at Volume 75. Chester smiles a devious smile and says that Olayinka won't regret it as we fade back to ringside.

11. **New Atlantic Tag Team Championship Match:** The New Dawn (Adelmar Sauer & Reginald Dampshaw III [O]) defeated Sweet As Honey (Ethan Giles & Honey Smith [X]) with The Family Name (Osaka Stunner) (18:13).

*V1 for The New Dawn*

- As mentioned on Twitter, Adelmar Sauer of **The New Dawn** hasn't had the best luck in these sudden rematches, but with Reginald Dampshaw III in his corner, he's got to like the odds. Of course, **Sweet As Honey** proved themselves to not just be one of REBELLION's greatest tag teams, but perhaps one of the greatest tag teams in the world as they took down challengers from all over. After earning a win against The New Dawn a few weeks prior, they've got a shot at redemption, but the odds might be too much for even Ethan and Honey to beat.
- For a long time, the REBELLION tag team scene was a bit anemic to be perfectly frank, but the recent influx of great teams has put a spotlight on wonderful aspect of wrestling and that was on display as these two teams battled for the belts. Ethan played fair, but used some savvy manoeuvring to find himself in comfortable pinning predicaments on The New Dawn. Honey also excelled as she held firm against the onslaught that Ademlar and Reginald brought. But as hopeful as the two REBELLION fan favorites were, they still had to contend with the sheer brutality of The New Dawn and they kept it together for a good bit, but eventually the walls came tumbling down.
- It looked for a moment like we were on the verge of getting new champs as Honey attempted her Chica-Wing Lock, but Reginald managed to slip out of it and with a thunderous European uppercut, he kept Smith stunned just long enough for The Family Name. Ethan tried to break up the pin, but a huge running big boot from Adelmar put a halt to that.

## 12. SEGMENT

- We spot **Kaelan Laughlin** in the back getting ready for her upcoming title match in tonight's main event when **Ally Gregory** walks into the scene. Kaelan's ready to fight her old foe, but Ally says she's not there to fight. She says that last week wasn't about stealing the spotlight, but instead, trying to do something good for once. Ally knows the two have never seen eye-to-eye in the past, but as much as they may dislike each other, Ally dislikes Holly and Kenzie just as much. And Ally says that she's here just to let Kaelan know she's got her back tonight should Kenzie get involved.
- While Kaelan appreciates it, she tells her that she won't need any help and certainly won't need any help from Ally. The best thing Ally can do tonight and for the future is to stay out of Kaelan's way. Laughlin walks off as Gregory shakes her head and goes her own way to prepare for her own match later in the night.

13. Aaron Gresham defeated Jacky Rex Daniels via DQ (15:22).

- It's been a path of tribalance for **Aaron Gresham** the last few months and while he's managed to put together some great performances as of late, he'd love to see those performances translate into a win. And again, that's going to be a tall order with former REBELLION World Champion **Jacky Rex Daniels** standing opposite of him.
- Early on, Daniels was in control of the match with Gresham never really able to get a foothold in the opening portions of the match. However, he would catch a big break about midway through as he countered a German suplex attempt and spun around into his Nicaraguan Suplex (Regal-plex) with a two count following it. After that, things were a bit more even between the two competitors, even after Jacky's Modern Art (Grounded Octopus Hold) almost gave him a submission victory.
- And as things were starting to tip in Jacky's favor, **Will Neilson** showed up at ringside in a scene not all too dissimilar a week ago. The lapse would cost Jacky as he would eat a stunning elbow shot from Aaron that saw Gresham set Daniels up for Dream On! However the former world champ slipped out of it and instead of continuing the match, he punted Aaron right between the legs and ran toward the ropes for a suicide dive to Will! The referee called a DQ in favor of Aaron and hurried to the outside as Jacky and Will were brawling out into the crowd!

#### 14. SEGMENT

- With **Jacky Rex Daniels** and **Will Neilson** still brawling, **Richard Olayinka** makes his way out on the stage to try and restore order. Eventually the ring crew does that and it would appear as if Jacky accepted Will's challenge with this brawl, but Richard says that he's going to turn it up a notch. The two men will face off at Volume 75 and it'll be contested as a Street Fight! The crowd pop for that and the two wrestlers seem content with the announcement as they are ushered to the back separately. With all that action settled, we fade to an intermission.
- During that intermission, a video package plays featuring another Volume 75 match and it's the main event between **Lisa Seldon** and **Zachariah Baldwin** for the vacant REBELLION World Championship. The moment the title went up for grabs, it was anyone's game and with a shot already guaranteed for Zachariah, he got to sit back, and watch the REBELLION Rumble unfold. It was originally thought that Lisa would only be staying in REBELLION for a one-off, but sticking around has proven well for her and with the absence of Cosmo Cooper, it seems like she's assumed that role in the meantime. But only time will tell if she'll live up to that by taking the REBELLION World Championship or if Zachariah's revolution is meant to come sooner rather than later.
- After that package and a couple more slides of intermission, we go back to the ring. Except it's not time for a match. Instead, we hear "Long Live the Chief" by Jidenna play and that can only mean **Dante Cutler** has made his way back to REBELLION! And in what should be a hero's welcome, it's instead a return shrouded in boos as the Evolution World Champion made his way out with his

manager **Smokey Mayfield** in tow. The duo were booed as they climbed into the ring and Smokey was handed a microphone.

- Throughout the last few weeks, Dante's been pestering James Edwards at any given chance and that's for good reason, Smokey says. Smokey says that James Edwards is a pest, a menace, and a no good scoundrel. Yet, James thinks that he's somehow on the same level as Dante. You can look anywhere in the world and find a wrestler like James Edwards, but a champion, no, a multi-time champion like Dante Cutler is a rarity. There's a reason James wasn't booked this week and it's because Dante and Smokey made that happen. REBELLION management favors someone like Dante over James, Smokey claims.
- Now James says he wants a cage match against Dante. That ain't happening. As a matter of fact, as long as James Edwards is still wrestling in REBELLION, Dante Cutler isn't going to be competing. The fans boo at that, but the two in the ring don't care. And if James has an issue with that, he can take it up with Smokey at Volume 75, where Smokey will convince James to leave REBELLION for good or he'll keep him off further cards. With that, he drops the microphone, and the two make their exit as the fans keep booing them.

15. Kaven Drell defeated Ally Gregory with his Kill Drell (Jumping Double Underhook DDT) (17:54).

- A big match for both wrestlers with **Ally Gregory** and **Kaven Drell** looking to pick up a win here. Ally's been on a more wrestling-oriented path as of late and it's paid off, but she's still looking for that one win to really launch her forward. As for Kaven, he came into REBELLION hot and has cooled down a bit, but as long as there's chaos? It's a good night for Kaven.
- A tightly contested match that sees Kaven get the advantage with the combination of his pure aggression and strength, but Ally was able to tap into the same kind of aggression. The action wasn't contained to the ring as they spent a bit on the outside, including Ally whipping Kaven right into the turnbuckle post at one point. Gregory also hits her AK Spinebuster on the ring apron that saw her roll Drell in for a two count. Kaven's Tolling Bell (Ripcord Elbow) nearly knocked out Ally for a three count, but she managed to get a shoulder up at the last second.
- A tense end to the match with both wrestlers fighting on even ground, but it'd ultimately come down to Kaven slipping out of Ally's Death Grip attempt to lift her up right for Kill Drell! The pin was made and even as the crowd rooted for Gregory to kick out, it was just too much, and Drell picked up a big win.

## 16. SEGMENT

- After Drell's win, the camera fades to black as we get a video package! And once again, it's the **Dead End Friends!** The video is similar to the one we saw last week as it shows various clips of Benny Stevens and Zack Fantana in action, but the one major difference this week is that "COMING SOON..." has been replaced. At Volume 75, Dead End Friends will be making their in-ring debut! And

while we don't know who they'll be squaring off against, it'll for sure be an experience to remember!

17. Precious Pepper Vain [O] & STRiFE defeated Arabella Townshend & Claire Lichfield [X] with a Collapsing Star (Diving Double Stomp) (14:38).

- With two big titles matches happening at Volume 75, both **Claire Lichfield** and **Precious Pepper Vain** are looking for some momentum heading into their title defences against **STRiFE** and **Arabella Townshend** respectively. Though the champions shouldn't get too cozy with their partners tonight as they could be potential challengers somewhere down the line.
- The teams took a bit to gel, but team chemistry didn't really matter here for the most part as the champions and challengers were focused on one another. That being said, STRiFE made sure to make her presence felt in the match as she went after both Arabella and Claire while PPV took some time to soak it in. STRiFE's Red Reign (Wrist-lock spun into Open Palm Strike) on Townshend that just about knocked her out until Lichfield broke the pin up. Later on in the match, Arabella would return the favor with her London Calling (Death Valley Driver) on STRiFE for a two count as well. We got some champ vs. champ action to close things out as PPV popped Claire with a high angle German suplex with a bridge that was broken up by a back senton from Arabella. And lastly, we got Lichfield tying PPV up with her Vorvolaka (Tarantula Figure Four Necklock); concerned more with breaking the Dragonweight Champion than winning the match.
- And as the match went all over the place, it'd come down to the champions squaring off. Claire fell back on her judo background and looked to toss PPV down, but Vain would subtly rake the New Atlantic Champion's eyes before spinning Lichfield around into the Killing Stroke (Straight-jacket Suplex). PPV quickly ran over to knock Arabella off the corner before she headed up and let out her signature shriek as she crashed onto Lichfield with her Collapsing Star for the three count as Townshend was halfway into the ring.

## 18. SEGMENT

- Backstage, **Alexandria Boucher**, REBELLION's resident interviewer, catches up with **Aaron Gresham**, who picked up a win tonight against Jacky Rex Daniels, albeit most likely in a non-favorable fashion. Gresham says that he's glad he picked up a win and is confident he could've beaten Jacky with or without the match ending the way it did. That said, he can't be too negative about it. As far as he's concerned, the record books are only going to show Gresham picked up a win over the former REBELLION World Champion.
- He says that after this week and Volume 75, a lot of opportunities are going to present themselves and while he's not sure what his next goal is at the moment, he knows it'll be picking up some gold at the very least.

19. Jenson Idol drew with Tyson Gregory after a double countout (19:06).

- A match riddled with arrogance as both men sought out to prove that they were the better wrestler. While they may be friendly outside of the ring, it'd be an

entirely different case here as **Jenson Idol** and **Tyson Gregory** would fight to help get themselves back into a title picture moving forward.

- Love'em or hate'em, the match was an intense one and a great one to watch. It was obvious that the two friends were familiar with one another's strategy as they always seemed to be one step ahead of the other before things got too out of control. After plenty of near falls, the momentum started to shift in Idol's favor after he managed to catch Gregory with Break Bread (Sliced Bread #2), but that wouldn't be enough to put Tyson down for a three. The match ended up spilling to the outside and once there, we saw Tyson get himself up on the edge of the ring before running off to hit The Falling Star (Shooting Star Press) right onto Jenson.
- But the action wouldn't get back in the ring after The Falling Star and the two would only continue their brawl on the outside. The referee tried to give the wrestlers as much leeway as possible, but eventually was forced to start a twenty count. Tyson caught Jenson with a massive lariat only for Idol to get right back up and hit a snap suplex on his friend. However, that seemed to be his last ounce of energy and the men stayed on the outside floor. As the referee's count got closer to 20, the two started to crawl back toward the ring, but the bell sounded before they got in!
- A draw was not how Jenson or Tyson wanted this one to end, but it showed just how even level the two wrestlers can be. A tough one for both men, but perhaps a sign that maybe teaming up once again wouldn't be such a bad idea. Jenson extended his hand to Tyson and the two would shake hands; getting a bit of a pop from the crowd only for the two to ruin any good will by giving the Manchester fans the double bird before making their exits.

## 20. SEGMENT

- As we get ready for our main event, the camera goes to the back where **Kenzie Rowe** is getting ready to watch the European Championship match unfold. She acknowledges the camera and says that she's basically been given an opportunity to go after whatever championship she wants. Maybe she'll go after the European Championship. Maybe she'll go and fight to get the REBELLION World Championship. Or maybe she'll try something new. The New Atlantic Championship or the Dragonweight Championship. Hell, maybe she'll go after the Manchester Championship just to work her way back up for the fun of it. The world's her oyster and Kenzie's going to keep an eye on everyone.

## 21. **European Championship Match:** Kaelan Laughlin defeated Holly Chainsaw © with her Price Paid (Contra Code) (28:49).

*Holly Chainsaw falls in V6. Kaelan Laughlin becomes the 7th European Champion!*

- Fans will remember **Kaelan Laughlin** coming into REBELLION as the CWC United States Champion and while she's made a name for herself all over the world, she hasn't quite been able to have the same level of success in REBELLION. Kaelan has had her chances in the past, but complications outside of REBELLION would force her to miss multiple chances at the REBELLION

Championship. Over a year later, Kaelan's got another chance to hold gold for the first time in REBELLION in the form of the European Championship, but with the belt wrapped around **Holly Chainsaw's** waist, that's a task easier said than done. The two have crossed paths before and have made it very obvious that they do not think very fondly of one another. The referee has to separate them during the introductions before kicking this one off proper.

- You could make an easy case for Holly Chainsaw being the greatest wrestler in REBELLION's short history and her massive reign with the European Championship being another example of that and Kaelan Laughlin was all too aware of that in this one. Her approach to the match was a methodical one as she focused on her technical background and did her best to negate Holly's expert brawling ability. The champion fell victim to a variety of quick holds from Laughlin that served to wear her down and Chainsaw struggled to find a counter against them.
- And while Laughlin is notorious for being one of the toughest wrestlers around, Chainsaw was able to put some cracks in her armor once she managed to free herself and dip into her arsenal. A sequence of dizzying European uppercuts put Kaelan on dream street before Holly planted her with a nasty backdrop suplex on The Fox's head and neck. The Horrorshow got that momentum rolling for her after that and lit Kaelan up every chance she had with a good number of near falls following.
- Surprisingly, this was one of the few matches tonight where all the action was contained in the ring and it created a tight atmosphere as a result of it. It also meant there was little time to recover and the wrestlers had to be smart with their movements; opting to go for a pin after a big move or staying back in an attempt to catch their breath. Such as the case with an avalanche back suplex from Kaelan that wiped out both wrestlers, but she was just too exhausted to try and make the pin as Holly stayed looking up at the lights.
- The closest the match came to going outside was when Chainsaw locked Laughlin up in the ropes with her Hoxton Crab (Rope Hung Boston Crab) that she held onto for some time; knowing a disqualification would still see her leave Volume 74 and the referee's five count was slower as a result. Eventually she did let go and Kaelan would get her revenge with her Irish Rose (Inverted Figure-four Leglock). Holly would get to the ropes for a break, but Kaelan wouldn't release the hold until the referee got to four.
- We did almost get a draw as Holly leveled Kaelan with her Chainsaw Burst (Running Double Knee Strike) only for Laughlin to pop up with her From Belfast With Love (Superkick) with a burst of energy out of nowhere. Once again, the competitors were down and out and the referee started a ten count, but they'd eventually stir before the count reached its conclusion.
- The match started to slow a bit after the 25th minute and got to the point where the two were stalking one another knowing that all it took was one lucky strike to put an end to things. Taking the initiative, Kaelan charged right at Holly, and the

two engaged in a massive strike exchange with forearms and elbows being traded back and forth. The act looked to have paid off for Laughlin as she pushed Chainsaw back for a second From Belfast With Love! But Holly pulled the referee in front of her at the last second and Kaelan blasted the official instead!

- Kaelan was stunned at what happened and before she could turn back to Holly, she was taken out with a lariat! The fans were booing as Holly picked up her European Championship from the corner, waiting for Kaelan to get up, and as Laughlin did, Chainsaw came running in ready to blast her challenger in the face! But Kaelan ducked it this time around! And Holly turned back to eat a second From Belfast With Love! The champion was stunned and Laughlin hooked her for the Price Paid with the back of Chainsaw's head hitting the championship! The official woke up just in time to see the in being made and counted to three!
- The bell sounds and after 265 days, Holly's reign has come to an end and Kaelan Laughlin is REBELLION's new European Champion! Months and months of chasing the title has finally paid off and now Kaelan's got her first piece of hardware in REBELLION. Everyone in The Stark Ballroom are on their feet as Kaelan grabs the belt and holds it up high for the world to see. The camera stays on that shot as Volume 74 fades to black!
