**PETER'S PENCE - RETIRING COLLECTION** – Peter's Pence is a collection taken up annually in Catholic churches worldwide, where the faithful offer financial support to the Pope. These funds are used to support the Pope's charitable works, including disaster relief, humanitarian efforts, and support for the Holy See. Historically, it began as an annual tribute from England and spread throughout Europe, evolving into a voluntary contribution from Catholics globally. This collection normally takes place on the Solemnity of St. Peter and St. Paul, but to space out our collections we will be having it this weekend 12/13 July.

**SEA SUNDAY – 13<sup>th</sup> JULY** – Next Sunday the Church will pray especially for all those who live and work at sea. There will be a retiring collection on 26/27 July for *Stella Maris*, Apostleship of the Sea, the official maritime welfare agency of the Catholic Church. It provides practical and spiritual support to seafarers visiting our ports. They are away from home and family for long periods and often work for low pay in difficult conditions.
