What you definitely should **NOT DO** is **PLAY WITH** different formts!

Your Kindle or Ereader has its OWN FONT set, so just use one font for your entire book.

BUT: Do NOT put "Wikimedia" or "Wikipedia" in your copyright text!

Amazon may block your book if you use too many open domain pics from Wikipedia, ESPECIALLY if you use a pic from Wikipedia on the cover of your book.

Instead use the "CC-BY-3.0" text from the applicable wikimedia page where you found the pic.

ABOUT FONT SIZES, as you can see above, for the copyright text I chose a different font size. Use this at your own risk — small text does not always render. However I have had good results by only using TWO DIFFERENT font sizes in a document. You will have to experiment. In the Kindle guidelines it is **not recommended**.

## Preface

This book is not really an Ode, it is not a poem at all, but more of a dedication. I chose the subtitle 'an Ode to Scottish Terriers' based loosely on this description from powerpoetry.org:

The trick to writing an ode poem is to write using the same structure throughout, while using different words to communicate the one thing you are writing about."

'Amazing' and 'Praiseworthy'; these two words describe Scottish Terriers so well that there was no other choice than to use 'Ode'!

This is a properly formatted Ebook in accordance with Amazon's KDP, <u>Kindle Direct Publishing guidelines</u>. You can replace all of the text in this template with your own and simply upload it to Amazon's KDP platform along with a cover pic — done!

DO NOT CHANGE THE LINE INDENTATION. DO NOT CHANGE THE PAGE BREAKS. DO NOT CHANGE THE SPACES BEFORE OR AFTER PARAGRAPHS. Just replace these texts with your own and everything will be fine.

#### Remember:

- 1. 1st line indent = 2 spaces, adjust the sliders in the ruler at the top of your page do not do this manually while writing with the space bar! (That will make rendering problems later.)
- 2. Space after each paragraph add in word "line spacing pulldown menu", not manually!
- 3. Chapter Headings = Heading 1
- 4. Page break (ctrl+enter in word) after end of chapter!
- 5. No page numbers an Ebook doesn't have pages.

If you need to add a chapter; in your word document (.doc, .docx) write "CHAPTER X" and make it HEADING

1. Then right click in the field of the table of contents and in the pulldown menu click on "update". After each addition of a Chapter, make sure to update your table of contents at the beginning of the book!

If you have footnotes, you will have to use some advanced editing tools; e.g. <u>Kindlenotes</u>. Please see this schematic I have made of the entire process.

When you are done inserting your text, make sure to delete all of the blue highlighted hints[]!

#### **Images**

According to the KDP help pages, "An HTML image with an aspect ratio of 9:11 automatically displays with maximum screen coverage." However, 9:11 is pretty square, and the Kindle Fires are very tall and narrow. The Kindle Fire screen is 3:5 and HD is 5:8. A picture that matches these aspect ratios won't perfectly fill the screen, though, due to internal margins (which can even be adjusted by the reader). If you make a picture 3:5, it might fit the Kindle Fire's tall, narrow shape, but then it might look rather funny on other ereaders with squarer screens. If you make the picture more square, it will leave a gap above or below (or beside in landscape view) the image on the Fire.

Below are the screen sizes in pixels of the various Kindles:

KF HD 8.9" is 1200 x 1920 1920÷1200= 1.6 aspect ratio, as per Kindle Publishing guide.

KF HD 7" is  $800 \times 1280$  = 1.6 aspect ratio

KF is 600 x 1024 = 1.7 "

Kindle Paperwhite is 758 x 1024 = 1.35 "

Kindle Keyboard is 600 x 800 = 1.333333

Kindle DX is 824 x 1200 = 1.456

Kindle Touch is 600 x 800 = 1.333333

Kindle 6" is 600 x 800 = 1.333333

iPad is 1536 x 2048 = 1.333333 Surface is 768 x 1366 = 1.778

#### MY RECOMMENDATION:

Resize all of your pics down to 1024x768. In my experience this works the best ACROSS THE MOST DEVICES — including iPad. This is very important, if you have color pic, you can say "This book looks awesome on an iPad!"

#### IMPORTANT!

There is a <u>DOWNLOAD PENALTY</u> in KDP if your file exceeds too many mb's. This is why you MUST resize your pics downwards. If you have a lot of pics you might get charged for the mb's! So what I do if I have a book with a lot of pics is resize them all down to 600x800, and leave a select few (the best pics) in a bigger size like 1024x768. This size looks FABULOUS on an iPad and you can enlarge it to see a lot of details. Any size bigger is just wasted mb's! Even with the iPad Retina display with a resolution of 2048x1536 — it is not necessary to make the pics bigger than 1024x768.

This is why I strongly recommend my method of building your .mobi file with Calibre, loading it onto your own Kindle or as many devices as possible and checking every pic yourself. Then modify your manuscript as necessary and re-build the .mobi with Calibre as many times necessary. Nothing beats seeing it with your own eyes before you upload!

This document already has the proper encoding, but if you opened it on your computer; it may be reformatted by your version of Word, because of some pre-sets or other miscellaneous settings — microsoft syndrome! Below is the official remedy from the Kindle Publishing Guidelines. If you have opened this document with Word and made no changes, it should be OK, but it is still worth checking before you upload to Amazon/KDP.

"If you are experiencing conversion failures when trying to upload HTML content, please open the HTML file in Notepad and save it with "Encoding: ANSI" (this is an option in the 'Save As' Notepad dialog).
