What can parents and guardians do at home to help children achieve reading success? Whenever the grown-ups of my students ask me how they can help their child learn to read at home, my number one piece of advice is to read with your child everyday. This can be in the form of the adult reading to the child, the child reading to the adult, or both! You can also play word games that involve rhyming, isolating beginning, middle, or ending sounds or counting syllables. I also recommend that

parents take time to research and learn about the Science of Reading. There are many podcasts and books out there right now that share eye opening information on the science behind how children learn how to read.

I have lived and taught in three different states: Massachusetts, Virginia, and California.
