Students develop an understanding of the importance of taking citizen action while at the same time get a deeper understanding of a particular government policy.

Throughout this project all FOUR Social Studies benchmarks will be assessed multiple times. Any missing component, incomplete section, or missing the issue fair will result in a non-passing grade for the second semester.
