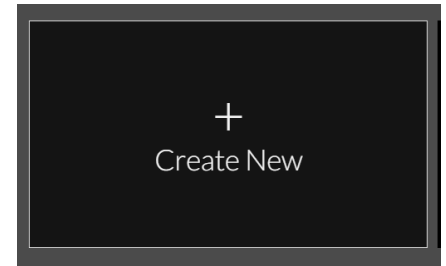
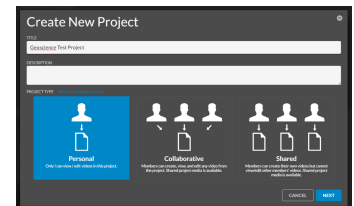


WeVideo

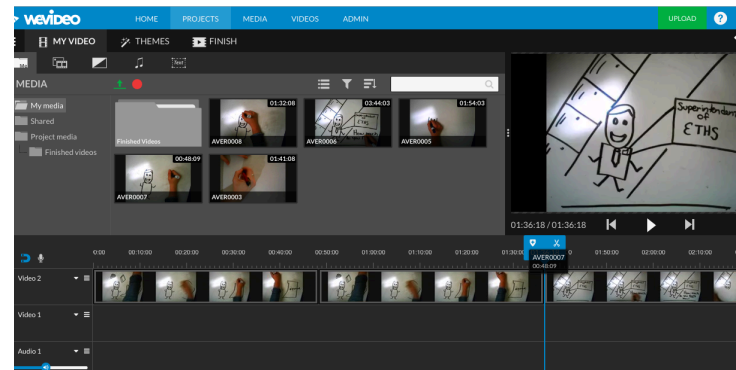
This is an online video editor that is accessible on student Chromebooks and allows for speeding up of clips as well as recording voiceovers.



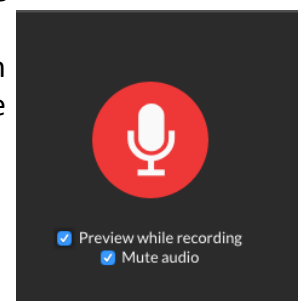
1. To create or join a WeVideo account, make sure you are logged into your eths202.org account and then visit [WeVideo's website](#). Once there, click on the Google icon to sign in/sign up with your Google account. Go through the initial setup steps to get your free account up and running.
2. Once you have your WeVideo account set up, click on "Create New" to start a new project. On the next page select "Project" and complete the title and description and choose "Personal" as the project type. You do not have any media yet, so skip the add media page if it appears.
3. Once in the video editor, click the green upload button next to the red record button to upload media to your project. You can also use the microphone button to record your own voice narration. You can click on the Google Drive icon in the upload menu to connect your Google Drive, which is a convenient way to import images and videos and also allows you to save your final videos in Drive when you're finished. Add any photos or videos you have stored in your Drive to the project. Alternatively, you may have stored photos or videos on the hard drive of your Chromebook. In this case, select "Browse to select" to grab them from your local storage.



4. Drag your photos and videos into the video editing bar below the clips and make sure they are in the right order. If you are planning to include text, we recommend using the top video track for text and the second video track for video/photos. This will allow text to appear on top of text/video (instead of being hidden behind it). You can drag the playhead (the blue line) to various spots to play them and you can crop video clips by clicking and dragging the edges. You can also play around with inserting different transitions and text by exploring the settings in the menu bar directly below the words "My Video" and "Themes."



5. You can double click on videos and pictures to get additional editing options for each.
6. To record voiceover after your video tracks are added move the blue playhead to the front of your video and click on the small microphone icon at the top of the page. Make sure to select "Preview while recording" so you know to line up your narration with your video clips. Once you save your audio, it will appear as a media item in the media library. Simply drag it down to the audio track of the editor to have it play during the video.



7. After your video is finished, click on the “finish” tab to export. Give your video a title, choose a thumbnail, and then select the Google Drive icon to save it to your Drive. It will be saved in a folder called WeVideo and may take some time to save and process, even after it is in Drive. Keep in mind that the free version only allows for 5 minutes of export time each month. Please only export your video when it is completely finished so you don’t run out of export time.
