NARRATOR: Ibney. Failed senatorial candidate. Current Senator. Current Vice Presidential candidate. Current Gubernatorial candidate. Why is he so ambitious? Let's take a look at the facts.

IBNEY: "...These are private adoption agencies who have the agency to decide who they believe to be best for these children..."

"...Abstain."

NARRATOR: Ibney co-sponsored an act to allow adoption agencies to discriminate based on subjective morality—including sexual orientation, religious orientation, and moral codes. He supported the bill

during debate, then changed his tone...but he didn't have the spine to say no to his Party leader.

IBNEY: "...while climate change is an interest, the only time the courts in the past have sided with the Government in such matters has been during times of...distress"

NARRATOR: "Ibney doesn't care about the environment, even as the coast is receding and airports in Sierra are drowning. He would rather continue to line the pockets of the corporations polluting the atmosphere."

IBNEY: "...I will resign, yes..."

NARRATOR: During the gubernatorial debate, Ibney agreed to resign his Senate seat in anticipation of election day. He has yet to do that.

Who will you vote for; a spineless Senator who cares more about corporations and religion than the public, or a candidate who has dedicated their entire life to Sierra?
