

What is the Coalition for Moderation Reform?

Put simply, the Coalition for Moderation Reform (CMR) is a group that anyone can become a member of if they have ideas about how to change osu!'s moderation practices for the better. It exists in order to gather the scattered strength of those with opinions on moderation and make this influence visible.

Membership

Anyone with an osu! account can become a member by filling out [this form](#). If you wish to stop being a member, DM a leader (either on osu! or Discord).

Membership may be revoked if:

- A user severely violates rules or displays opinions contrary to human or civil rights
- Someone acts on behalf of the CMR despite not having the power to do so and not representing a will expressed by the CMR as a group (such as claiming a proposal is supported by the CMR despite no such vote existing)
- Special circumstances apply where not revoking membership would significantly harm the effectiveness or ideals of the CMR

Proposals

Any member may post a proposal concept (an idea, possibly rough, for how to improve osu! moderation) in the Discord server.

If two* other members support a proposal concept, it will become a pending proposal. Members may discuss the proposal in general or in fine detail, and can vote to agree or disagree. Only one vote can run at a time, so if there are multiple proposal concepts with a sufficient number of members that support them, the one with most support will become a pending proposal first.

*number subject to change based on total amount of members

Once seven days have passed since a pending proposal was made or all members have voted, the votes will be reviewed, and if a majority of voters (and 1/4 of the total members) agreed, the proposal will be final.

It is then posted to the osu! forums by either the person that made the proposal, or, if they do not post it within 3 days, a leader, where it will be marked as “by the CMR”, and stats about the vote (agree, disagree, turnout) will be present.
