### Summary:

- 1. The potential for rain and possible thunderstorms continues to slowly increase daily.
- 2. Air quality at 2:16 PM today is in the Unhealthy range. Earlier this morning it was in the Very Unhealthy range.
- 3. Air quality 6/28 is projected to be in the Unhealthy Range.
- 4. Air quality 6/29, day of competition, is projected to be in the moderate range.
- Action Plan based on the Air Quality Index and recommendations from airnow.gov: See table titled "Air Quality Guide for Particle Pollution (as from Wildfires) and ISO Recommendations Regarding the Open Water Competition".
- 6. The possibility of delays or cancellation due to weather/air quality exists.
- 7. Another update will be provided Wednesday, June 27, 2023, on receipt of the water quality testing results, probably about midafternoon.

## II. Air Quality Due to Canadian Wildfires

- a. Air quality and ozone due to Canadian wildfires is tracked via airnow.gov and the National Weather Service, www.weather.gov.
- **b.** Air quality today, June 27, is in the unhealthy, or red zone.
- **c.** Recommendations for red zone:
  - i. People with heart or lung disease, older adults, children, and teens take any of these steps to reduce your exposure:
    - Avoid strenuous outdoor activities.
    - Keep outdoor activities short.
    - Consider moving physical activities indoors or rescheduling them.
  - ii. **Everyone else** take any of these steps to reduce your exposure:
    - Choose less strenuous activities (like walking instead of running) so you don't breathe as hard.
    - Shorten the amount of time you are active outdoors.
    - Be active outdoors when the air quality is better.
- d. Air quality for 6/28 is projected to be the same.
- e. Air quality for 6/29 is projected to be in the yellow zone by the time of the Open Water events.
- f. Recommendations for yellow zone:
  - i. Unusually sensitive people: Consider making outdoor activities shorter and less intense. Watch for symptoms such as coughing or shortness of breath. These are signs to take it easier.
  - ii. Everyone else: It's a good day to be active outside.
- g. Action Plan based on the Air Quality Index and recommendations from airnow.gov: See table titled "Air Quality Guide for Particle Pollution (as from Wildfires) and ISO Recommendations Regarding the Open Water Competition".
- h. Will continue to monitor air quality via airnow.gov.
