- Be prepared to discuss the questions below
- Actively participate in the meeting

Questions

This list of questions is only intended to guide conversations. You are welcome to talk about other related topics.

1. What do you think your plan will be for next year (2027-28)? It's okay if you don't know yet. How are you feeling about your ability to accomplish your goals for next year? What specific things do you need to be doing now, and for the rest of this year, to make that happen? (e.g. talk to a military recruiter, find out where you can train as an apprentice, apply for financial aid, apply to college, apply for scholarships, etc.)
2. Who can help you accomplish these things? Remember, the Future Ready Center staff are happy to help you. You can schedule an individual appointment to figure out what you want to do, or to get help with specific questions about applications, financial aid, etc.
3. HSBP #1 Future Career Assignment
 - a. SchoolLinks can help you figure out what careers might be a good fit for you. Login in here <https://app.schoollinks.com/login/k12> and login with Google. SchoolLinks also has information about schools, scholarships, volunteer opportunities, and more.
 - b. Most seniors schedule their interview or job shadow on or before Future Ready Day, Friday, October 16. For the Future Career Experience, you will be doing a career interview or job shadow to learn about a career that interests you. What leads do you have on people you can interview or job shadow? If you don't have any leads, what are some ideas you have for finding someone? Ask your mentor what suggestions they have for finding someone to work with. You can also see Ms. Compton in the Future Ready Center for potential contacts.

4. If you are planning to attend college, technical school, or trade school next year, are you planning to fill out the [Free Application for Federal Student Aid \(FAFSA\)](#) or [Washington Application for State Financial Aid \(WASFA\)](#) that opens on October 1?
5. Have you done your 10 hours of community service yet? If not, do you have an idea of what you will do? If you need ideas, visit the Future Ready Center website, or look for posts in Google Classroom.
6. Tell your mentor your ACGI/AP Government teacher and period so they can submit your grade.
