ESV	KJV	NASB	NIV
The end of all things is at hand; therefore be self-controlled and sober-minded for the sake of your prayers.	But the end of all things is at hand: be ye therefore sober, and watch unto prayer.	The end of all things is near; therefore, be of sound judgment and sober <i>spirit</i> for the purpose of prayer.	The end of all things is near. Therefore be alert and of sober mind so that you may pray.

[LSB] The end of all things is at hand; therefore, be of sound thinking and sober *spirit* for the purpose of prayer.

[LSB] Above all, keep fervent in your love for one another, because love covers a multitude of sins.

Show hospitality to one another without grumbling.	Use hospitality one to another without grudging	Be hospitable to one another without complaint.	Offer hospitality to one another without grumbling.

[LSB] Be hospitable to one another without grumbling.

As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace:	¹⁰ As every man hath received the gift, <i>even so</i> minister the same one to another, as good stewards of the manifold grace of God.	As each one has received a <i>special</i> gift, employ it in serving one another as good stewards of the manifold grace of God.	Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms.

whoever speaks, as one who speaks oracles of God; whoever serves, as one who serves by the strength that God supplies—in order that in everything God may be glorified through Jesus Christ. To him belong glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen.	If any man speak, <i>let him speak</i> as the oracles of God; if any man minister, <i>let him do it</i> as of the ability which God giveth: that God in all things may be glorified through Jesus Christ, to whom be praise and dominion for ever and ever. Amen.	Whoever speaks, <i>is to do so</i> as one who is speaking the utterances of God; whoever serves <i>is to do so</i> as one who is serving ^o by the strength which God supplies; so that in all things God may be glorified through Jesus Christ, to whom belongs the glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen.	If anyone speaks, they should do so as one who speaks the very words of God. If anyone serves, they should do so with the strength God provides, so that in all things God may be praised through Jesus Christ. To him be the glory and the power for ever and ever. Amen.
