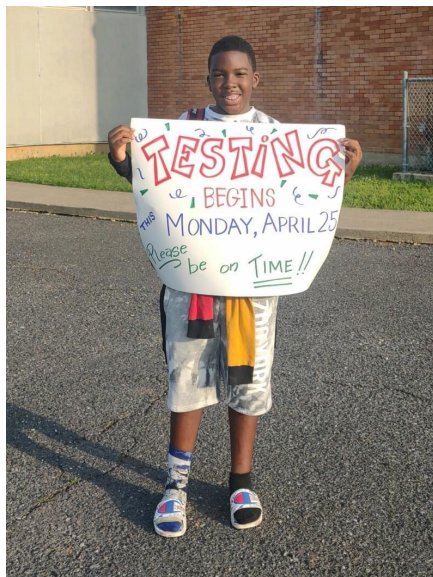




Director's Report - Curriculum and Instruction

May 2022



Required summative state testing took place at each school during the month of April. Summative tests are required to be administered in person. Principals and test administrators report that students have given their best effort on state testing. Make-up testing will continue until the testing window closes on May 20th.

Perritt administered the NWEA (Literacy and Math) online to all students in grades K-2.

Peake administered the ACT Aspire online (Math, Science, Reading, English, and Writing) to students in grades 3 - 5.

Goza administered the ACT Aspire online (Math, Science, Reading, English, and Writing) to students in grades 6 - 8.

AHS administered the ACT Aspire online (Math, Science, Reading, English, and Writing) to students in grades 9 - 10. The ACT was administered online to 11th grade students.

Planning continued for summer programs to be offered on each campus to address COVID learning loss.

AHS will participate in the state-sponsored Pre-AP program for the 2022-23 school year. Pre-AP Algebra I, Pre-AP English I, and Pre-AP English II will be offered. Plans include more Pre-AP course offerings in subsequent years. Pre-AP is no longer available at the middle school level.

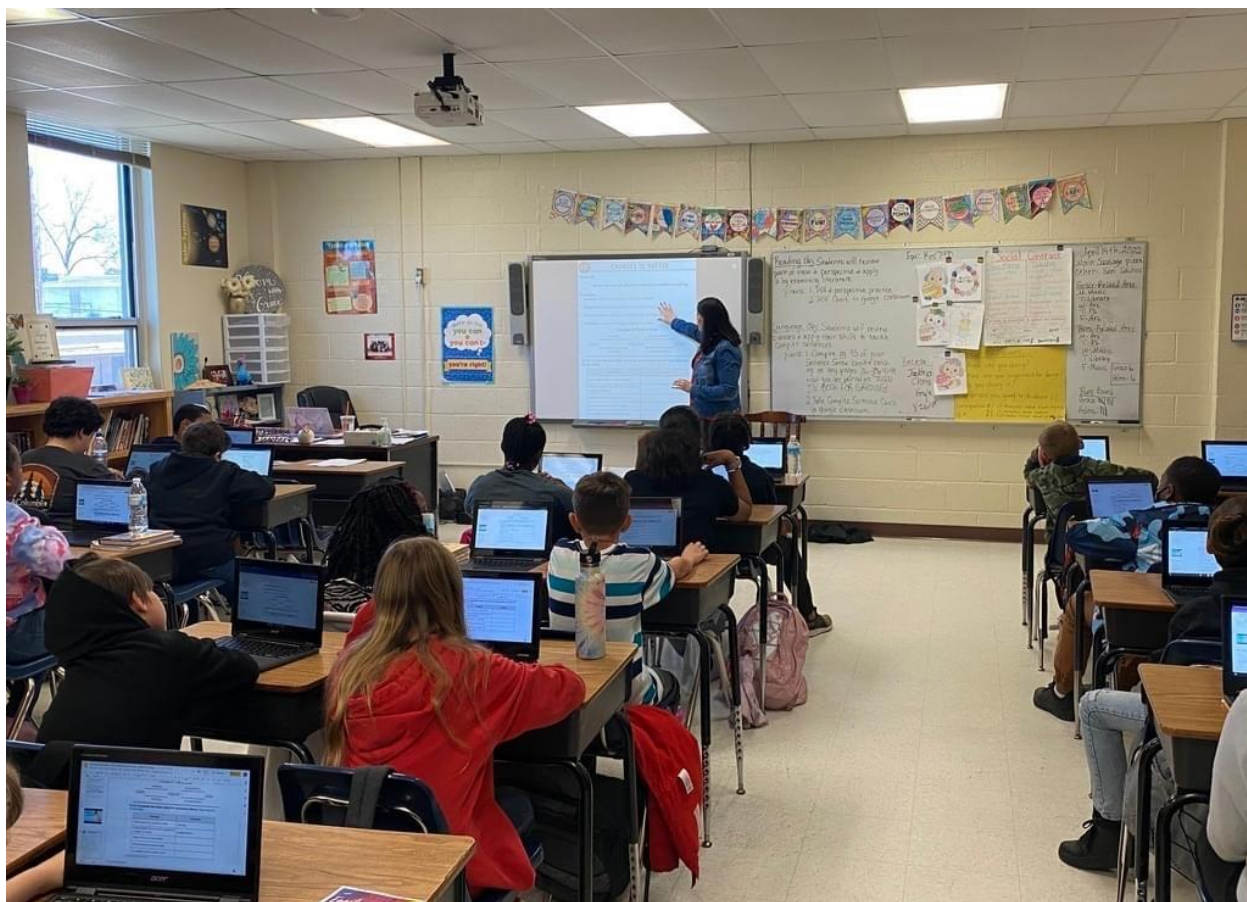


The recording of the First Grade Spring Musical was released on April 12th. Perritt hosted a watch party for families that evening.
