The Inverted Pyramid

A typical article following this structure has three main parts: The Lede, the Body, and the Tail.

The Lede (The "Who, What, When, Where, Why, and How")

This is the most critical part! It's usually the first one or two sentences and must grab the reader's attention and summarize the entire story. Goal: Answer as many of the 5 W's and 1 H as you can, clearly and quickly.

The Body (Important Details)

Key Moments: Describe the turning point of the game. Example: The Mavericks fought back from a two-set deficit, dominating the final three sets.

Player Quotes: Add quotes from the star player, the winning coach, or a competitor. This adds emotion and personality. Example: "We never gave up," said Mavericks' captain Francine Smasher, "We knew we had to focus on every serve and every rally."

Background: Mention how well the teams did to get to the final. Example: Both teams were undefeated heading into the final match, setting up a rivalry clash.

3. The Tail (Extra Background)

Future Plans: Mention what happens next for the league or the players. Example: This concludes the elementary volleyball season.

Minor Details: Include information that isn't essential for understanding the result. Example: Over 100 parents and students attended the final, making it the highest-attended game of the year.

Example:

The Marion Schilling Mavericks secured a dramatic fifth-set victory over the South Sahali Sharks on Thursday afternoon at the Tournament Capital Centre, clinching the Kamloops Elementary Volleyball Championship with an electrifying spike from Captain Sally Smasher.
