

K & 1st Grade: Folk Music and the Banjo

1. What is folk music?

 Watch this video to learn about the banjo, folk music, and a new (but old) song:

Cluck Old Hen and I Had a Rooster | Music Arts Toolkit

- "Folk music is music that is played or sung by ordinary people (not professional musicians).
 It is traditional music that people learn by listening to other people playing it and then copying them."
- Some folk songs you might know:

She'll Be Comin' Round the Mountain I've Been Working on the Railroad Skip to My Lou There Was a Man and He Was Mad Frog Went A' Courtin



2. Questions to think about:

- What are both songs about? Why do you think rural people would write songs about animals? What role do animals play in our lives today?
- How do the banjos in the songs differ (in appearance, sound, etc.)? What other music have you heard that includes the banjo?
- What other songs about animals have you heard?

3. Join in!

Make up your own verse of the song!

passed down: People add their own
verses and change the song.
