Battle	Date	Location	Winner	Importance
Battles of Lexington & Concord	April 19, 1775	Right outside of Boston, Mass.	Colonial Victory	Lexington –  "shot heard 'round the world" (1st shots of the American Revolution)  • 8 colonists killed  • British march on to Concord looking for weapons Concord –British find no weapons in Concord  • British retreat to Boston  • British suffer over 273 casualties
Bunker Hill	June 17, 1775	Boston, Mass.	British Victory	<ul> <li>Costly British victory</li> <li>Over 1,000 British soldiers killed or wounded, colonists lost only 400 men</li> <li>Showed that the war would be long war and that the Americans can fight bravely</li> </ul>
Battle of Saratoga	Oct. 17, 1777	Saratoga, New York	Colonial Victory	<ul> <li>British tried capturing the Hudson River &amp; splitting the colonies in two - they failed</li> <li>Colonial Victory – TURNING POINT IN THE WAR (France joins the United States' side)</li> </ul>
Battle of Yorktown	Oct., 1781	Yorktown, Virginia	Colonial Victory	<ul> <li>British General Cornwallis was trapped in Virginia by the Colonial &amp; French Army</li> <li>Major Colonial victory – marked the end of fighting in the United States</li> </ul>
