

DEBATE AUDITION INSTRUCTIONS

For debate auditions, please submit a video of a previous rebuttal speech you've given in your primary debate event. If you primarily participate in policy debate, submit a 1AR, 2AR, 1NR, or 2NR. If you primarily participate in the Lincoln Douglas debate, submit a 1AR, NR, or 2AR. If you primarily participate in Public Forum debate, submit an affirmative summary, negative summary, or final focus. If you participate in another debate event (World Schools, parliamentary, etc.) use your judgement.

You may either submit a video of an actual debate round or of a "rebuttal redo" (delivering a rebuttal speech again after you've returned home and practiced it). If your video is from an actual debate round, you may record either the full debate or just your speech, but if you record the full debate: 1. ask for permission from everyone else participating in the debate; and 2. indicate which speech you would like us to look at.

You may record your video on a video camera, your computer, or your phone.

If you did not debate this year or do not have a speech you'd like to submit, you may create a constructive speech on the following topic for any style of debate:

RESOLVED — The tenure of United States Supreme Court justices should be limited to a specified duration.
