Please find enclosed I. L. Alcorn's letter to me: Which I am glad I have to send you; I had overlooked it owing to having been mailed at Memphis; you will see my recollection was right, after leaving you I met with a Mr. Johnson from Tennessee who is farming in your vicinity, who told me he believed there was a negro on the land who Alcorn had put there. It would be well to know if such is the case; I believe I told you the name and age of the orphan: if not her name is Nannie O. Hamilton and her age will be twenty two the 13th day of April next.

I have other papers showing that Alcorn was Dr. Hamilton's attorney and agent but I think his letters will be sufficient. Please acknowledge receipt of this; and let me hear if there are any new developments in the matter;
