Which Democrat was Donald Trump seemingly most afraid of in the run-up to the 2020 election? Joe Biden

John Bolton was Trump's National Security Advisor between 2018 and 2019.

Mary Jordan of The Washington Post claimed Trump asked the President of Ukraine to "do him a political favour" and then, "you'll get your aid"

Trump claimed the allegations against him were a witch hunt

In a press conference, Mick Mulvaney was seemingly acknowledging that there was a so-called Quid Pro Quo between the USA and Ukraine

On 24th September 2019, Nancy Pelosi - the Speaker of the House of Representatives - announced the start of an "official impeachment inquiry"

Pastor Mark Burns says that Trump placed "two Conservative Justices" on the bench, and claimed that Trump was "pushing to put the prayer back into schools"

In October 2019, the impeachment process begins in the House of Representatives

Miles Taylor says Trump likes to use "dog whistles", which is why many Republicans chose to back Trump through the impeachment process

In voting on whether or not to convict Trump, the Senate votes 47 Guilty and 53 Not Guilty

On 4th February 2020, President Trump delivered his State of the Union Address, and claimed that, "the best is yet come". At the end, Nancy Pelosi ripped up Trump's speech

On 24th March 2020, Trump led a press conference is order to relax social distance restrictions, claiming that, "our country wasn't supposed to be locked down"

In May 2020, George Floyd was murdered by a white Police Officer. The footage sparked protests in cities across the US, including New York City, Detroit, Los Angeles, and Washington, DC
